The Georgia convict system gives to the counties the right to lease from the State whatever convicts the counties may be able to use on , the public roads. The balance, about 1500, were let to private parties for the net sum of about \$250,ooo per annum.

We should like to see all the convicts able to do work placed on the public roads and as some of the counties might not be able to use them let the counties hire them from the State and give the State the revenue. It would help along the good road movement as much as anything else. Labor of convicts on the public roads would pay very much greater dividends than working on farms and growing cotton and corn. South Carolina has about 800 convicts and it is considered good business management if the superintendent is able to turn into the treasury \$10,000 a year.

The new sidewalks add very mue' to the comfort of the pedestrian not to speak of the appearance of the town. There are some sidewalks where the water from the streets run down the sidewalk whenever it rains. These should have attention.
