

GENERAL NEWS NOTES.

Items of More or Less Interest Condensed Outside the State.

The Powers have submitted to the Porte a scheme for the amelioration of affairs in Macedonia.

Lou Dillon trotted a mile on the Memphis track on Saturday in 1.58 1/2, breaking the world's trotting record, and for the second time she is queen of the turf.

Sir Henry M. Durand, British ambassador at Madrid, has been appointed British ambassador to the United States.

The recently completed Asheville, N. C., Auditorium and a private residence, the two valued at \$50,000, were destroyed by fire on Sunday. Insurance, \$20,000.

Percy S. White, of Bonham, Tex., one of the students at Washington and Lee University stricken with typhoid fever, died on Saturday.

There were two big bank failures in Pittsburg, Pa., last week. The Federal National Bank failed one day and was followed by the failure of the First National of Allegheny on the next day.

John K. Brown, for 13 years cashier of the Union bank, at Holland, Ohio, has been arrested at San Francisco charged with embezzlement. He disappeared from Ohio in August and it was found he was \$103,000 short in cash.

W. S. Love, of Savannah, Ga., who has been missing from his home for several months, and who was reported drowned, has been found in Denver, Col., by the agent of an insurance company in which Love held a policy. Love says he was not trying to defraud the company and did not seek to conceal his identity.

Typhoid fever broke out at the Virginia Military Institute at Lexington, Va., last week. Nine cases were reported and the students were furloughed for one month. Typhoid fever is also prevalent at Washington and Lee, at Lexington. The prevalence of the fever in these two universities and in the town of Lexington is attributed to lack of a sewerage system in the town.

The entire summer resort of Virginia Beach with its two large hotels came near being destroyed by fire on Sunday night. As it was five handsome cottages were destroyed and many thousands of dollars lost with no insurance, and the whole property would have gone had it not been for the heroic work of the crews from the three life-saving stations who acted as firemen.
