Death of Mrs. Frances M. Percy.

Mrs. Frances M. Percy, mother of the Rev. J. H. Percy, pastor of Whitmire, Prosperity and Enoree churches, was buried at Mt. Tabor church, near Whitmire, on Friday afternoon, the Rev. J. F. Anderson conducting the funeral services. The sermon was preached in the Whitmire Baptist church from Ps. 116: 15: "Precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of his saints."

The deceased was born January 11th, 1822. With her husband, the Rev. George Percy, she spent nine years in China as a missionary of the Cross (1846-55). The last ten years of her life were spent in the home of her son, the Rev. J. H. Percy. She leaves the said son and his three children; the three eldest children of the Rev. I. M. Mercer, D. D., whose first wife was her daughter, Fannie; four brothers, two sisters and a host of relatives and friends to mourn her departure. She lived a life of piety and usefulness. She died a death of simple trust in Jesus.
