

RED CROSS CHRISTMAS SEAL CAMPAIGN

To-day opened the Red Cross Xmas Seal Campaign in the United States for \$6,500,000 and South Carolina started in with a vim to do its part in raising this amount for the fight to stamp out the Great White Plague. With the close of the Red Cross Roll Call, the new set of campaigners leaped forward this morning to tell the people what tuberculosis is doing to the nation and for the State.

The campaign is being waged by the National Tuberculosis Association through the various state and local tuberculosis associations. The South Carolina's part of the budget, upon which depends the continuance of the battle to wipe out the most dreaded of all diseases, is \$65,000. That the State will not be contented with doing only its part, but will do more than its share is the opinion generally expressed. The more South Carolina raises the more work will be done in this State to combat the disease and to build up preventatives.

Governor R. A. Cooper is Chairman of the Campaign Executive Committee for the State. Realizing the great necessity for the success of the campaign and having his State's welfare at heart, the Executive has had the committee's headquarters established in Committee Room No. 9 of the Capitol, where he can give the work his personal supervision. Associated with the Governor on the committee are: Dr. James A. Hayne, Vice-Chairman, Dr. L. A. Riser, Fitzhugh McMaster, John P. Thomas, Jr., A. S.

Manning, Treasurer, Miss Chauncey Blackburn, Secretary, Mrs. F. S. Munsell, Campaign Manager, Mrs. C. Y. Reamer, Mrs. Annie I. Rembert and Mrs. Ruth Dodd.

Between December first and tenth, during which period the seals will be placed on the market, the people of the State will be asked to buy 6,500,000 seals at one cent each. The 1919 seal will be identified by the smiling countenance of Saint Nicholas wishing everybody who purchases seals a "Merry Xmas, Health and A Happy New Year."

A new feature in this year's campaign will be the health bond representing 500 seals. The bond will be sold for five dollars and will be redeemed in twelve months of perfect health. Attached will be the coupons, each month's representing a way in which the contribution will aid in the war on tuberculosis. Some of the mediums are the local tuberculosis associations, tuberculosis sanatoria, care of tuberculosis soldiers, open air schools, preventorium and children camps, vocational training for cured and arrested cases, research work and tuberculosis surveys, tuberculosis clinics, tuberculosis visiting nurses, annual physical examinations, modern health crusade and health education.

BOLL WEEVIL NEWS.

Clemson College, Nov. 13.—Owing to the continued warm weather and the scarcity of squares, migration of the cotton boll weevil is still in progress and unless stopped by cold weather there is no way of knowing

at this time, where this migration will end, says Professor A. F. Conradi, of the Crop Pest Commission. At this writing (Nov. 12) the weevil has been found at Hartwell, Ga., a little south of Anderson, and at Laurens and Kershaw. The northernmost point reported by North Carolina is Chadbourne.

No boll weevil maps are being issued at this time because such maps made one day would become obsolete and misleading by the next. The line indicated below as a current one and may have changed by the time this article reaches the reader. The line on November 12 would run approximately as follows: Hartwell, Ga., Anderson, Laurens, Kershaw, S. C., and Chadbourne, N. C. It would not be surprising, however, to find weevils at some points much further north than this line within the next few days. Weevil movements are governed by weather, by abundance of squares and by abundance of cotton. In sections where cotton is thin, weevil migration is more rapid.

In order to protect the little free territory which is still ours, the safety line runs through the following points approximately: Mountain Rest, Pick-

ens, Pacolet and Rock Hill, and joins the North Carolina line approximately at Van Wyck. There is no longer any need for the quarantine zone.
