Columbia, Nov. 21.—The South Carolina Automotive Trades Association has launched a plan by which it hopes to check the theft of automobiles in this state and to aid in the recovery of those that are stolen. The association has asked each member to notify the secretary in Columbia immediately on the theft of the car, giving number of the car, license number, motor number and a full description of the car. The secretary will, immediately upon receipt of the notification of the theft, asking them to be on the lookout for same. He will also place notices in the papers, a very large number of which have already promised to co-operate with the association in the recovery of these cars.
