**ANOTHER BIG ROCKEFELLER GIFT IS ANNOUNCED**

New York, Dec. 26.—Yesterday the announcement was made that John D. Rockefeller had given away \$100,000,000.

Half of this amount goes to the General Education Board, a Rockefeller creation, and the other half goes to the Rockefeller Foundation, a corporation chartered "to promote the well-being of mankind throughout the world."

While there is no available absolutely authoritative list of Mr. Rockefeller's benefactions, it is estimated by those who are in a position to know the facts, that all of his donations

for social, religious, welfare, and educational purposes now amount approximately to \$500,000,000.

In 1915, when appearing before the Industrial Relations Committee, John D. Rockefeller, Jr., upon being asked to state the total amount of his father's public gifts to date, said that he estimated them to be a quarter of a billion dollars. Using this estimate as the basis, the items making up the total of half a billion dollars are as follows:

Perhaps the single gift which most nearly approached in size this latest gift of Mr. Rockefeller, is that of Henry Frick, who disposed of his will for general welfare purposes of a sum which was at first estimated at \$117,300,000, but which, on account of taxes to be paid from the amount will, it is said, fall to \$82,000,000 or \$15,000,000 less than this latest Rockefeller gift.
