

SCHEDULE OF BOLL WEEVIL CONFERENCES

Meetings to be held in thirty-three counties in January.

Clemson College, Dec. 27.—According to announcements made recently the Extension Service will conduct in January a series of county conferences on the boll weevil situation and a safe farming program for South Carolina in the presence of the weevil. Thirty-four of these conferences will be held in thirty-three counties. The conference for Lexington County will be held at Lexington Jan. 22.

Specialists of the Extension Service and other authorities who have had successful experience in fighting the boll weevil will be organized into two parties and thus two County Conferences will be held each week day between Jan. 6 and Jan. 30 inclusive, as shown in the schedule below.
