Columbia. Jan. 24 .- The general assembly of South Carolina is urged in a statement issued last night by J. Skottowe Wannamaker, president of the American Cotton Association, to make certain amendments in the South Carolina Warehouse act. Mr. Wanamaker urges that a commission of seven, one from each congressiona. district, be created co-operate with the warehouse commissioner and that the commissioner be given authority to license warehouses.

"The cotton industry is gradually every line of the cotton industry, even being put upon an economic basis. A bale of cotton should have the grade stencilled upon it; we should have licensed graders, men who have taken a thorough course in grading, stapling and fibering of cotton.
