A petition signed by one-third of the resident qualified electors and one-third of the resident free-holders of the age of twenty-one years in School District No. 14, known as Page's Mills School District, having been submitted to the County Board of Education of Marion County asking that an election be held in said School District upon the question of establishing a High School out of the territory embraced in said School District, such an election is ordered to be held at Oak Grove School House on Saturday, September the Eighteenth, nineteenth hundred and nine, between the hours of seven o'clock a. m. and four o'clock p. m. The trustees, E. L. Rogers, H. Rogers, and A. Q. Page, shall act as managers at said election. Those favoring the formation of said High School District will vote for "High School," and those opposing the formation will vote against "High School." Only such electors as return real or personal property for taxation and exhibit their tax receipts and registration certificates as required by law in general elections will be allowed to vote.

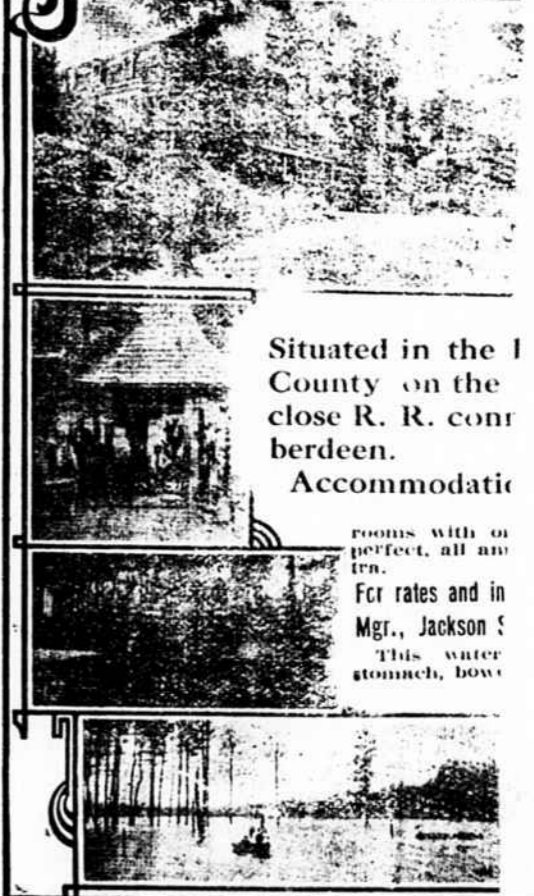
