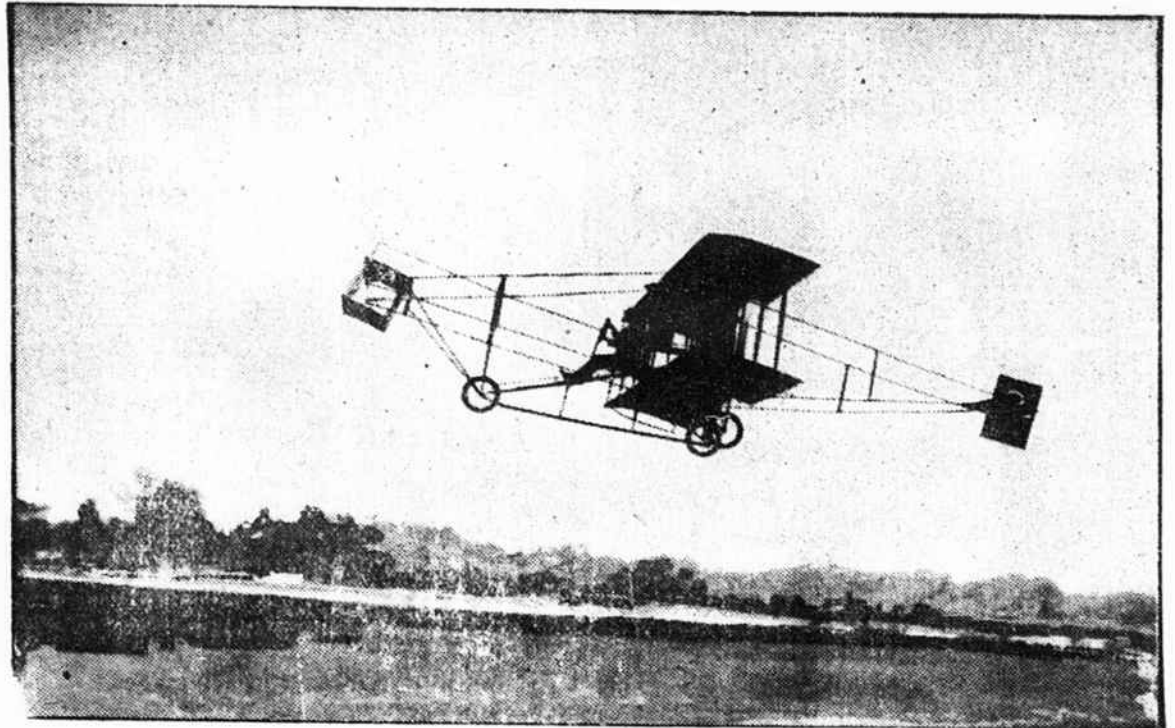
The Airship at Dillon

TUESDAY DECEMBER 20TH.

When the famous aviator, Ely, will make several exhibition flights at the race track in a Curtis biplane. Ely will arrive in Dillon Sunday night from Atlanta and everything will be in readiness for the great flight

Tues. Dec. 20th at 2 p. m.

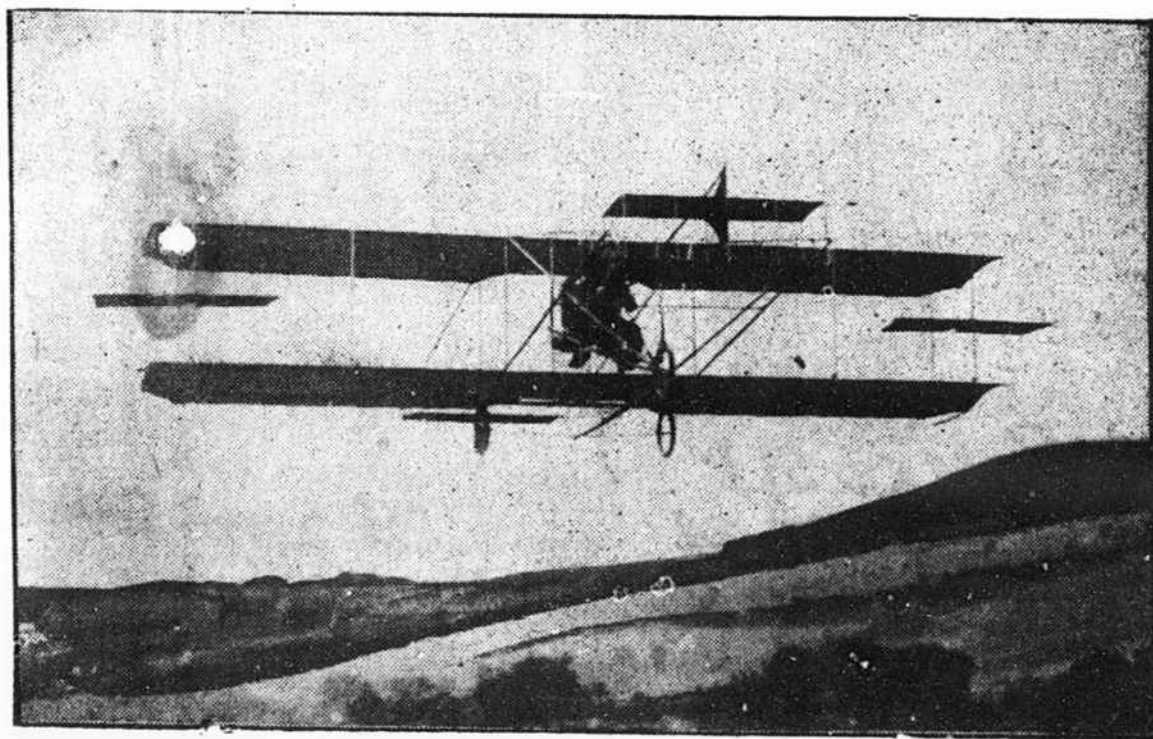
Now is your opportunity to see one of the greatest of modern inventions in actual practice. Tuesday will be Dillon's great day and preparations have been made to entertain from six to ten thousand people. Ely is under contract to make three long-distance exhibition flights and during one of the flights he will rise to a height of

700 FEET IN THE AIR

He will circle the city and make a long distance flight into the country while at this great altitude, never being out of sight of the spectators.



The above picture shows the "Great White Bird" in mid-air. The machine is now climbing up into the heavens and in ten minutes after leaving the earth it becomes a mere speck in the sky.

Another feature of the event will be a race between the airship and a high-powered automobile ten laps around the track (5 miles) at a speed that will exceed 50 miles an hour. In this race the aviator will execute all the dangerous curves—the same curves that have cost many a daring aviator his life. The flights will be made from the centre of the track and the race course will enable 20,000 people to get an unobstructed view of the great machine in operation.

Reduced rates have been secured on all railroads for a radius of 100 miles and Dillon opens wide her gates to the entire Pee Dee country on this occasion. Remember the flights begin at 2 p. m. on
