Cannery for Fort Mill.
An enterprise designed to partially combat the invasion of the boll weevil in the Fort Mill community is a cannery which is now being organized by business men of the town and farmers of the township. A meeting of those interested in the promotion of the cannery was to be held in the town hall this afternoon and in behalf of the enterprise it is stated that if proper cooperation is secured profits will not only come to farmers through growing vegetables to be canned and marketed but also from the sale of the products of the cannery. Subscriptions to the stock of the cannery have been readily secured and it is believed that the organization of the enterprise will be effected at the meeting this afternoon. Experts from the extension department of Clemson college are expected to come to Fort Mill to assist in the organization of the cannery.

Wm. Henry Chapman Dead.
Following an illness of about ten days, Wm. Henry Chapman died early last Thursday morning at the home of his father-in-law, J. A. Fite. Mr. Chapman was about 21 years old and was married six months ago to Miss Mary Fite, who, with his parents, Mr. and Mrs. J. A. Fite, survives him, beside several brothers and sisters. Funeral services were held at the home Friday morning, the Rev. J. W. H. Dyche, assisted by the Rev. W. R. Bauknight, officiating. Interment followed in the city cemetery with military honors. Mr. Chapman being a member of the Tom Hall Guards.
