SAXON MINISTER

OF WAR MURDERED

Herr Neuring Dragged From Ministry, Beaten, Thrown Into River, Then Shot. Killed While Trying to Swim to the Shore.

Copenhagen, April 13.-Herr Neuring, war minister in the government of Saxony, was killed at Dresden yesterday by disgruntled soldiers to whom the minister had refused a hearing. The war ministry was stormed by demonstrators who dragged out Herr Neuring and threw him into the Elba, where he was shot and killed as he tried to swim to the bank.

Wounded patients in the Dresden hospitals, say the Desdren dispatch, detailing the occurrance, collected in the morning in the theatre square to protest against an order issued by Herr Neuring to the effect that the wounded in future should receive only peace time pay. Five or six hundrd men formed a procession to the war ministry and sent a deputation to see the minister who refused, however to receive them.

Upon this the crowd, incited by Communistic speakers, stormed the entrance to the building. The sentries used their weapons but were overpowered. Government troops were summoned but they declared they would not attack the crowd and marched off after surrendering their arms.

An excited crowd meanwhile had thronged the square in front of the building and machine guns posted at various points were firing on the ministry. At four o'clock in the afternoon the demonstrators had forced their way into the main building, followed the war minister to the upper story, where he had fled and dragged him into the street.

After the minister had been severely maltreated by the crowd he was hurled from the bridge into the river When he tried to swim to the bank the demonstrators fired at him and within a few moments he disappeared under the water.
