a strong run of hogs, helpe dto cause the weak market.
While the average drop for hogs was at $\$ 1$, the difference between today's lowest point was fully $\$ 1.50$, live ock authorities sald, while the aver rom 50 to 75 cents a hundred pounds. sheep also sold, lower.
