HARRIS TALKS UP STOCK BREEDING

CHEAPER EVERY WAY BY HALF TO BREED AND RAISE YOUR OWN HORSES AND MULES

THE BOLL WEEVIL IS HERE

Necessity Will Now Force the Farmer to Raise Everything He, His Family and Livestock Must Eat

Columbia. "It is cheaper to raise horses and mules in South Carolina than it is to buy them—cheaper by one-half," says Commissioner Harris, who has had enough experience to know what he is talking about. "There is no state in the United States that can raise a horse or mule or pound of pork or dairy products or pound of mutton any cheaper than can be done in the state of South Carolina. We now know that the boll weevil will invade South Carolina, for he's here. And it now behooves the people of this state to diversify their farming so as to raise everything that the farmer will need for food for himself and family and for live stock on his farm. What little cotton he grows will be his own and he will be able then to name his own price."

"I have been farming 39 years and I have never bought a horse and I don't use mules. I bought a filly colt for \$30 before I was married and I have raised every horse that I have used on my farm ever since. There is no good in a mule when he lies down and dies, but a mare will leave the farm well stocked when she goes and will have done as much work as the mules."

State Crop Conditions.
The condition of cotton in South Carolina on October 25, according to report of Bureau of Crop Estimates issued through its South Carolina Field Agent, was 60 per cent of normal as compared with 61 per cent on September 25th. The October condition report has not been interpreted in terms of bales. However, the report of Field Agent, B. B. Hare, of September 25, indicated a total production in the state of 1,127,000 bales, the final out-turn, as he stated at the time, would be greater or less according to whether weather conditions thereafter should be better or worse.

Wannamaker to Retire.
J. Skottowe Wannamaker will retire as head of the South Carolina Cotton association at the big meeting, to be held here on December 2, to perfect permanent organization. This announcement is contained in a letter which Mr. Wannamaker is sending to the county chairmen calling attention to the big meeting to be held here. His duties as president of the American Cotton association make it unpractical for him to retire as head of the state organization, he says.

Protest Price Fixation.
Washington.—(Special).—Senator Dial conferred with Director Whitney of the bureau of soils at the department of agriculture in regard to an order issued to the trade by the bureau forbidding under pain of prosecution for profiteering the sale of any of certain fertilizer materials, including cotton seed meal, at prices higher than those prevailing October 7. Senator Dial has made representations to the department that the order can have relatively little effect on the fertilizer market, less than 14 per cent of the cottonseed meal produced being used as a fertilizer ingredient, but that it will disastrously effect cotton growers and oil mills.

Must Compress Cotton.
Washington.—(Special).—Senator E. D. Smith, upon receipt of telegrams from New York asking that through bills of lading be issued on cotton shipments from Bishopville for foreign ports, immediately took the matter up with authorities here and was informed that unless cotton is compressed it can not secure such through bills.

More Posts Allowed Legion.
Before the recent state convention of the American Legion of South Carolina, it was possible to have only one post in each county, but now, that the constitution has been changed, one post is permitted in every city or town, provided there are not less than 15 veterans applying for the charter. Already a number of places, heretofore without a chapter, are taking steps to get a post in their respective towns. Applications should be made to state headquarters of the legion in Columbia.

To Enlarge Baptist Hospital.
The Baptist convention showed by every action that it favored progress and that it stood for the upbuilding of its several institutions. This was emphasized by the unanimous decision to enlarge the Baptist hospital, indorsement of the new dormitory for Furman university, recognition of the need of a fine arts building at Greenville Woman's college, and the assurance that \$200,000 of the \$75,000,000 campaign money would be used as an endowment for that institution so as to qualify it for class A classification.

Campaign For Memorial Lagging Badly Behind
