Members of the state committees are appointed to serve from one convention to another, and are mem-

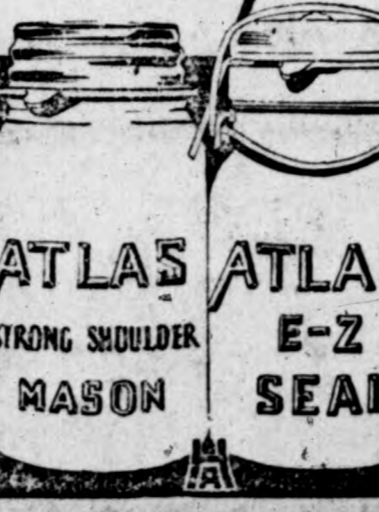

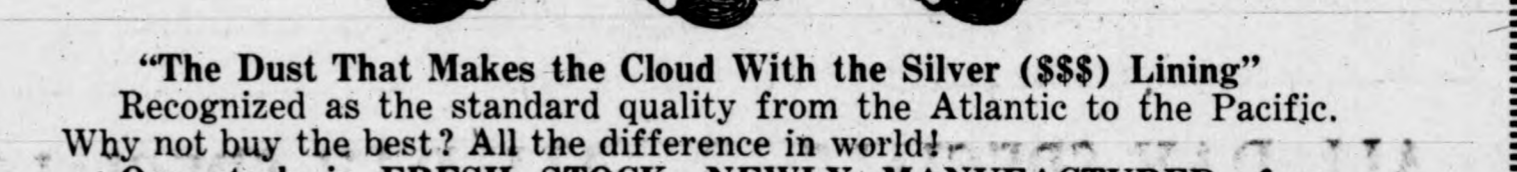

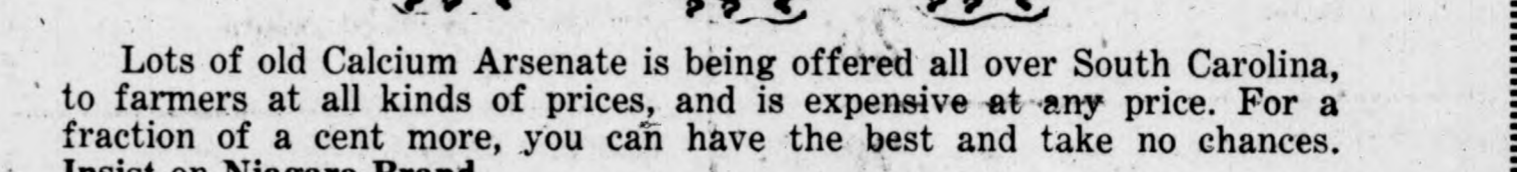
