**Famous Stage Star Is Shot**

New York, June 9.—The bodies of Margaret Lawrence, stage star, and Louis Bennison, former stage and motion picture actor, were found today in Miss Lawrence's Penthouse apartment on the roof of an East 51st street apartment hotel. Both had been shot to death and police said Bennison had killed the actress and then committed suicide.

Details of the double shooting were not immediately available, as police ordered reporters barred from the house pending their investigation. It was learned, however, that the bodies were found by Miss Lawrence's maid. Possibility that the two had died in a suicide pact was indicated by two notes pinned to the bedroom door, the handwriting of which was identified by the maid as that of Miss Lawrence. One of the notes signed "Tiana," said "If the sunset has a heart, look for us there." The other read, "Notify Mr. Mussen at the Lambs club at once."

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**Hints for the Home**

"What pieces of silver will she need first," is a question that comes to all who make the bride a gift of sterling. And the most practical way to answer it is to lay out a dinner menu for at least four, and see just what is required to serve the meal correctly.

For the soup course. Select 4 dessert spoons; they are quite proper, and can be used for serving spoons at other times. Instead of bread and butter spreaders, 4 tea knives. (These can also be used for breakfast and luncheon service.) For the meat course, 4 dinner knives and forks; for salad, 4 dessert forks (instead of salad forks, which serve only the one purpose); for dessert, 4 more dessert forks will be needed, and 4 after dinner coffee spoons. And to this collection it is wise to add a dozen tea spoons.

**"Goodyear Day" To Be Celebrated**

"Opening of the new Goodyear tire plant at Gadsden, Ala., marks an impressive forward stride in the industrial development of the South. It is significant of our future that the world's greatest rubber company sees in the South its best opportunity for expansion."

These are the words of the Hon. Bibb Graves, governor of Alabama, in commenting on the celebration of Southern Goodyear day, June 15th. The new plant is the fourth manufacturing investment of the Goodyear company in the South, in addition to many distribution and branch establishments. The company already operates a 50,000 spindle tire textile mill at Cedartown, Ga., is building another 50,000 spindle mill at Rockmart, Ga., and recently purchased a third 50,000 spindle mill at Atco, Ga.

Gov. Graves' statement was wired today by Supt. F. A. Steele of the Gadsden plant to McDaniel Vulcanizing works, local Goodyear dealers. "Southern Goodyear day is a business celebration," says R. P. Chapman, of the McDaniel Vulcanizing works, "but it has a real interest for car owners, too."

"This is the first time a major tire company has actually built tires in the South. It means a lot, we think, that it is the one tire company that commands outstanding leadership in the industry. You will see that where Goodyear points the way, others will follow. I make that as a prediction—and want you to check me up on it. Just watch."

The local Goodyear dealers, in league with other dealers all over this, the Charlotte branch territory, have pledged themselves to sell in one day—June 15th—the equivalent of one entire day's output for the new factory—5,000 tires.

"That's giving a new Southern plant a real Southern greeting, isn't it?" asks Mr. Chapman. "Well, just watch us put it over."

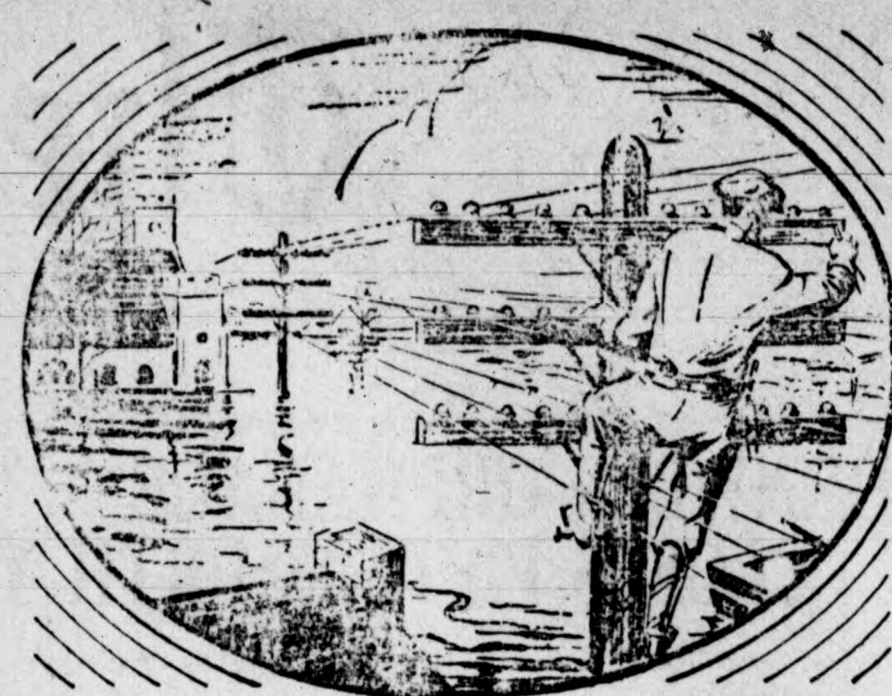
