## TAFT URGES U. S. COURTS TO ASSIST

Says They Should Help Hoover Bring Enforcement To All the Land. Conference Held In Capital.

Washington, Oct. 6.—Chief Justice Taft, in behalf of the annual conference of circuit judges over which he presided, issued a statement today calling on Federal courts throughout the country to lead in accomplishing the reforms which President Hoover hopes will result from his law enforcement commission headed by former Attorney General George W. Wickersham.

The chief justice warned the public that it must not look for too rapid improvement in law enforcement and said "the conference greatly rejoices at the urgent demand by the public generally for more efficiency, more speed and more certainty in the prosecution of the general criminal law which has led to the appointment by the president of a commission for the discussion and adoption of new methods, and a greater efficiency in dispatch in the consideration and prosecution of crime. The federal system for the punishment of violations of the federal crime statutes offers an opportunity to the federal courts to lead in the matter of this reform. Congress has been engaged in the last few years in stiffening the prosecution of violations of federal criminal laws, and in rendering more efficient

the procedure in such cases. The working out of these changes is necessarily slow, and we must not look for too rapid improvement. Much remains to be done in this regard."

The conference will ask congress to provide that all criminal cases shall be expedited as soon as they reach a circuit court of appeals, and be heard not later than the session following that in which they are filed.
