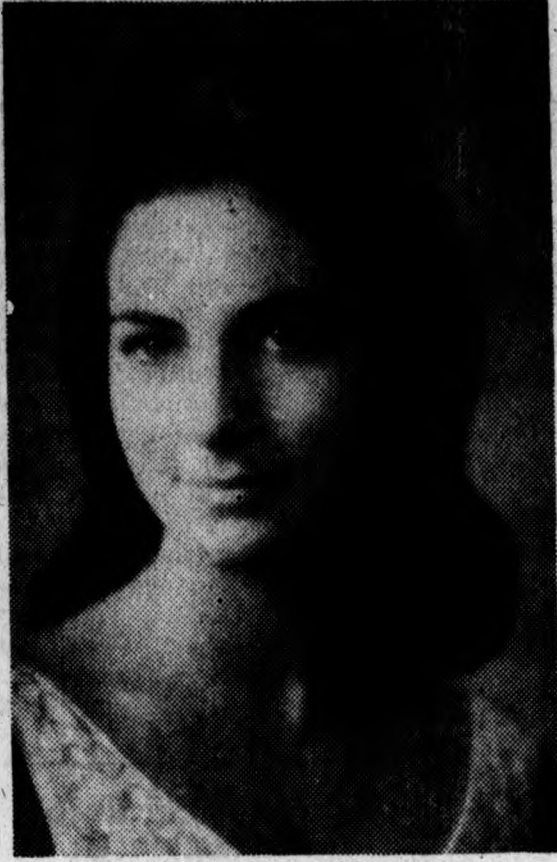
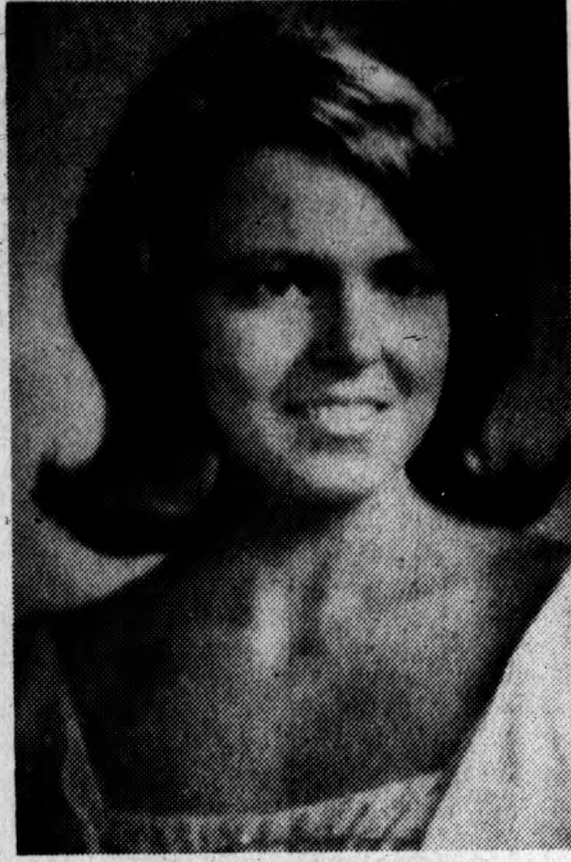


18 Debutantes To Be Presented At Cotillion Club Ball Tonight



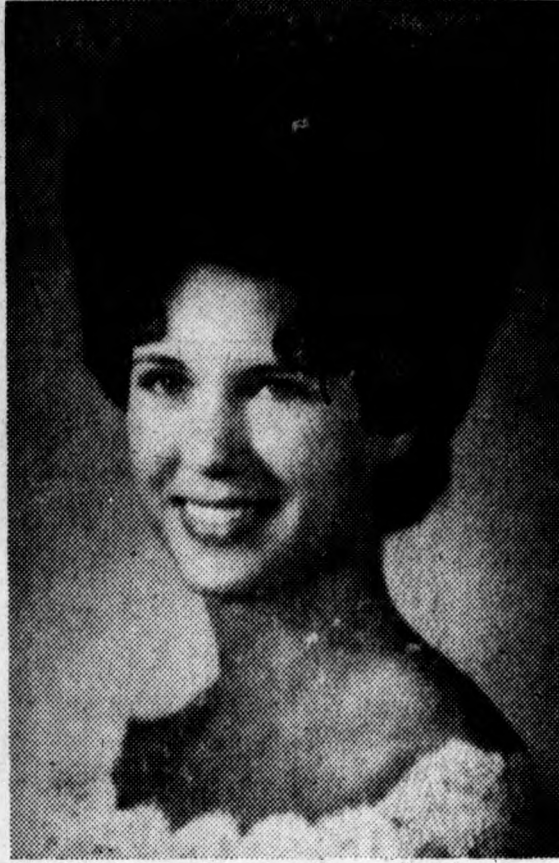
