FOR THE NEW YEAR

3. I will be alert and willing to give the other fellow a boost - tactfully - even though this may mean letting him get the credit.

4. I will earnestly and energetically seek the economic and spiritual welfare of my family and myself, and, at the same time, devote a substantial portion of my time to the

welfare and interests of those about me.

5. I will be scrupulously honest, sincere, and loyal in all my thinking and acting.

6. Whatever I do will be done with all my heart and soul, with a passion for thoroughness.

7. I will cultivate the art of patience under all circumstances, beginning at home.

TIMELY TIPS

By The County and Home Agents

MINIMUM WAGE: Farmers who qualify must pay minimum wage beginning February 1, 1967. The problem is getting skilled labor to justify the salaries. In other words, "How will the farmer get his money's worth?"

HELPFUL HINTS FOR GRAVY: For smooth, lump-free gravy, measure fat and flour accurately. Too much flour makes gravy lumpy and too thick; too much fat makes gravy greasy and separated.

If gravy has lumps, pour it through a strainer before serving. If gravy is too greasy, skim a paper towel across it to soak up excess grease.

FREEZE BRANDING: A new method of identification has been developed by freezing the hide of cattle to 79 degrees below zero with a branding iron. This method causes the hair to drop out and white hair will grow back in its place. Paul Owings of Owings has just used this method to mark 100 brood cows.

COOKING VEGETABLES: To save vitamins and minerals as well as fuel, most vegetables should be cooked in the smallest possible quantity of water.

OPEN FIREPLACES: If you have an open fireplace, we hope that you will use it. There are plenty of hardwood trees available today that most farmers will be glad to give you for the cutting.

OVEN HINTS: Stagger pans on the oven racks in order to provide the best circulation and least consumption of heat.
