ITEMS OF INTEREST THROUGHOUT STATE

Negro Robs Same Store Twice—Attempt to Rob Safe in Laurens. Killed in Runaway—Death of Old Columbia Citizen.

B. W. Still, a young man of Greenwood, died Saturday from injuries received in a runaway.

William H. Monckton, Sr., one of the best known citizens of Columbia, died Monday, at the age of 83 years.

The wife of the manager of the "Wild West" show, that exhibited at Prosperity, lost her purse there, containing \$1,025.

I. M. Earlstone, one of the best known and most prominent among the Jewish citizens of Charleston, died suddenly in that city Monday.

Greenville: After remaining out 12 hours, the jury in the case of Sam McCarter, charged with killing Albert Dearman, returned a verdict of not guilty.

T. M. Howell, a Lexington county farmer, who was shot in a negro's house in Columbia Saturday night, in Columbia, died at a hospital there Monday.

George R. Koester, lately concerned in an effort to establish a new morning paper in Columbia, has bought the Evening Piedmont, in Greenville, and will run that.

Mrs. J. J. Major, of Anderson, has sent her check for \$1,000 to Rev. A. T. Jamison to establish an additional scholarship in the Connie Maxwell orphanage, Greenwood.

Anderson: The small shepherd dog that went mad Thursday and bit two white lads, two negro women and two negro boys, has been killed and its head sent to the Pasteur institute in Columbia for examination. The dog was killed late Friday night, seven miles northwest of the city, by a son of Tom Miles, who was out possum hunting and was attacked by the dog.

RED CROSS EMBLEM

American Society Seeks to Protect Its Use.

Washington, D. C.—The American Red Cross has asked the solicitor general of the United States to advise it as to the prospects for the enforcement of that portion of its federal charter relating to the use of its emblem and name for private firms and manufacturers in advertising. Such use of the red cross is punishable by a penalty up to \$500, or a year's imprisonment. It is believed that many persons who use the emblem and name for advertising purposes are not aware that such use is forbidden by law.

The United States has entered into a treaty with all of the civilized governments of the world to prevent the misuse of the Red Cross emblem or title. The law adopted by the United States specifically prohibits the use of "great red cross on a white ground, or any sign or insignia made, or colored imitation thereof, or of the words 'Red Cross' or 'Geneva Cross', or any combination of these words". The use is forbidden even for charitable purposes, except by the American Red Cross, its employees and agents.
