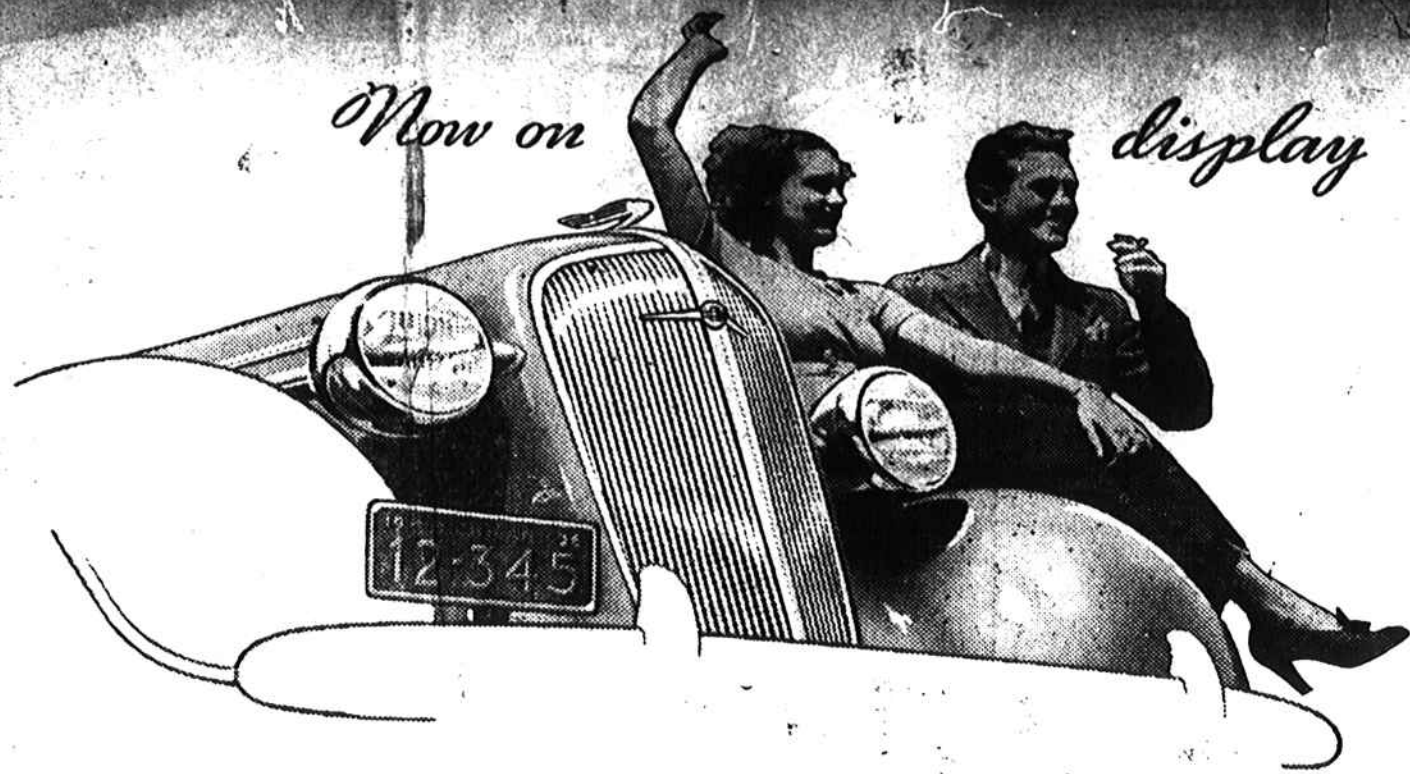
We are publishing below a statement of the finances of the Kershaw County Nutritional Camp as carried on in August by Rev. Craighill.

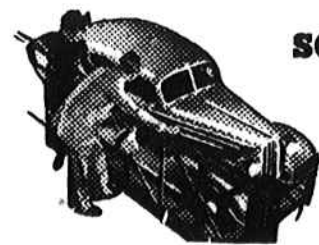

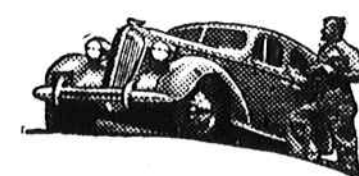

PAN DULCE

Here is an interesting sweet potato receipt good cooks ought to be glad to have at this season. It is reprinted from the Progressive Farmer and came originally from Mexico.

Pan Dulce

Ten pieces of raw sweet potato one inch square and one fourth inch thick.

Four tablespoons full of red cinnamon drops.

Three fourths cup of water.

Two tablespoon full of sugar.

Dissolve the cinnamon drops and sugar in hot water. Drop in the pieces of sweet potato and cook gently until tender and syrup is absorbed. Cut a round of pastry with a scalloped cookie cutter. Spread a piece of candied potato over half of each round, cutting the outer edge so that it spreads out fanwise over half of the pastry, allowing the edge of the potato to show. Brush the tops with white of egg and bake in a quick oven.
