

**Funeral Services  
Are Held For  
Jesse L. Williams**

Jesse L. Williams, former superintendent of the Pine Creek Mill (now the mill) died in the Camden hospital on July 26 after an illness of 12 days. He had celebrated his 80th birthday only about two weeks before his death.

Mr. Williams came to Camden 40 years ago at which time he assumed the superintendency of the Pine Creek Mill. He retired in 1917. He was well known and very popular not only in Camden but throughout the state.

He was the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. J. A. Williams of Glenn Springs, Spartanburg county. He married Miss Susan Busbee of Spartanburg, who preceded him to the grave by four years. On May 14, 1913, he and Mrs. Williams celebrated their golden wedding anniversary. She died about a year later.

Mr. Williams is survived by three daughters, Mrs. S. A. Lovett, Langley; and Mrs. Stephen B. Robinson and Mrs. Curtis Crolley, of Camden; one brother, W. V. Williams, of Taylors, Greenville county; eight grandchildren and nine great-grandchildren.

Funeral services were held at the Bethesda Presbyterian church, of which he was a member, on July 28, conducted by the Rev. A. D. McArn, assisted by the Rev. J. T. Dabney. The Masons had charge of the service at the cemetery and served as pallbearers.
