

Ask Local Nurses For Assistance In Polio Section

On Monday the Kershaw county chapter of the American Red Cross received a wire from the Southeastern area in Atlanta requesting that eight nurses be assigned to polio cases in North Carolina, South Carolina, as the need was very urgent.

After a survey of the local resources, no nurses were found to be available.

Eighty-four nurses from the Southeast have been recruited for North Carolina alone. Through the nursing service of the American Red Cross the organization recruits professional nurses for emergencies and also for the chapter nursing programs.

Red Cross home nursing classes are provided by local chapters to teach people to give simple nursing care to members of a family under the doctor's guidance.

To care for outbreaks of poliomyelitis in 1947 the Red Cross recruited 393 nurses to supplement nursing resources in 36 cities. Of 230 nurses assigned to Idaho, 213 served in Boise. To Akron and Cincinnati went 24 nurses each out of 66 assigned to Ohio. Twenty-two served in New York state. The Red Cross also recruited nurses for service in Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Maryland, South Carolina, Florida, Virginia, Rhode Island, North Dakota, Illinois, Arkansas, Minnesota, Texas, New Mexico, Oregon, California, Oklahoma and South Dakota.

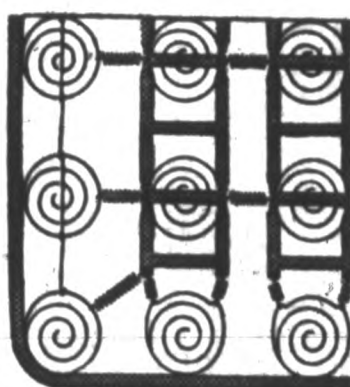
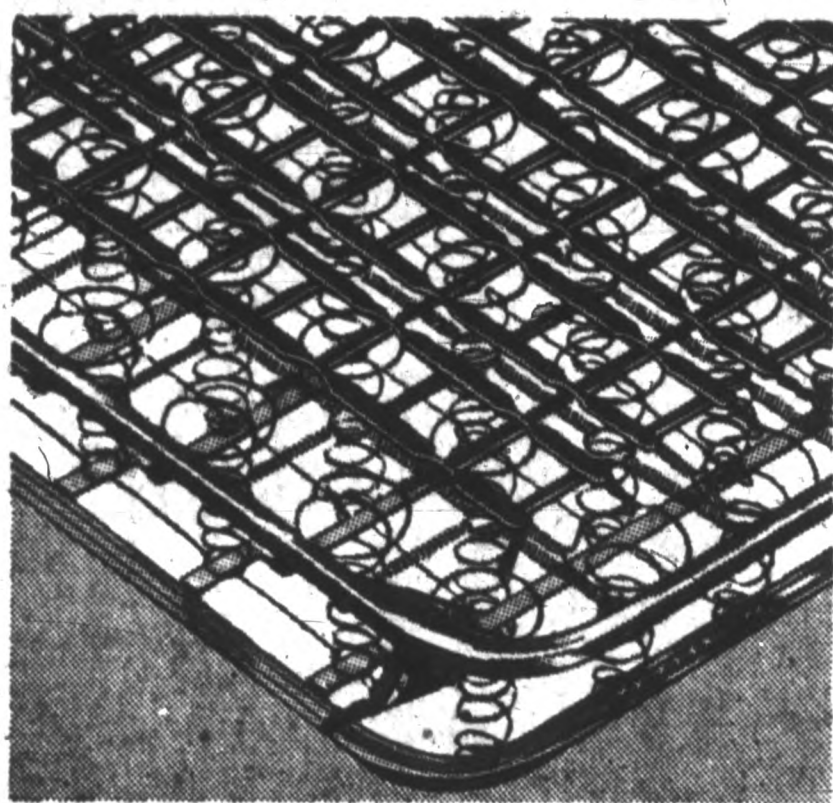
