

Pack Stake At Black Jack Beagle Club On Jan. 15

The Black Jack Beagle Club, Inc., located at the Shiver Mill club house, 12 miles southeast of Camden, will hold its second AKC Plan B, sanctioned combined pack stake Saturday, January 15.

Running will start with the 15-inch class at 8 a. m., while the 13-inch class will start at 1 p. m. Entry fee will be \$3 per hound with owners being limited to three hounds in each class. Thirty per cent of the entry fee will be divided 40, 30, 20 and 10 per cent. The first four hounds will be eligible to run in the win pack stake to be held Saturday, Feb. 5, at the same field. The public is invited to attend this event. Dinner is to be served at the club house at noon.

His Birthday Jan. 17

BENJAMIN FRANKLIN WAS A BROADMINDED THINKER

Benjamin Franklin, whose birthday is observed on January 17, was "the most acute and broadminded thinker of his day," in the estimation of the Encyclopaedia Britannica.

The first edition of the Britannica, published in 1768 when Franklin was 82, devoted many pages to his discoveries in the field of electricity. And today, 181 years later, Franklin is still praised by the reference work for his creative mind, his practical good sense and his humanitarianism.

"Other men may have been greater, but very few have been more human," the Britannica points out. "Franklin's achievements are so great and so numerous that it is impossible to sum up all of them," Britannica adds. His scientific interests ranged from his theory of electricity to speculations on the nature of earthquakes, and the Aurora Borealis, the origin of the common cold and the causes and cures of smoky chimneys.

Although he hoped to see American develop within the British empire, he threw all his energies into the colonial cause when his first hopes proved impossible.

"Nobody in the 18th century knew so well as he how to pull the wires of public opinion and make use of newspapers, secret societies and academies," the Britannica asserts. He served his country as a member of congress, postmaster general, minister to France, and delegate to the constitutional convention.

"He was the first American economist, a distinguished political thinker, and a fruitful social reformer," says the Britannica. "He was always clearer, less abstract and more practical than the theorists he followed."

Even the index to the Encyclopaedia Britannica reveals the remarkable versatility of Franklin's mind. References to him are found in such articles as the American Philosophical Society, an outgrowth of a club he founded, and the oldest scientific association in the United States; and listed under his name are found "Declaration of Independence," which he corrected;

"glass harmonica," a musical instrument he invented; and "University of Pennsylvania" which he helped to establish. "Nobody could approach him without being charmed by his conversation, his humor, wisdom and kindness," the Britannica relates. "He had a way of telling stories that delighted all his friends and was well liked by the ladies because he seemed equally to enjoy listening to them."

When he died in 1790, at the age of 84, "the whole civilized world was moved by the disappearance of the old sage who had done so much good during his long life," Britannica concludes. In 1799, according to the then Secretary of the Navy, the Navy's annual food needs were 1,600 bushels of beans and 12,500 pounds of butter.

Covered Cans For Refuse Are Needed

City officials are anxious to learn all about the cost of covered refuse cans before enforcing old state and city laws which require businesses and residences to deposit all types of refuse in covered containers. A recent investigation revealed that only a few business firms and a small percentage of homes were complying with the regulations. Violation of the ordinances helps to make refuse collection and disposal the most costly service the city offers, said City Manager Jack Tallent. In addition, it creates a health hazard, promotes the multiplying of flies, insects and rodents, not to mention the unpleasant odors and appearance it gives to private properties. With the current citizens' demand to "clean up" Camden, hardware and other city merchants, at the city managers request, have offered to sell covered refuse cans at a very small margin, to avoid forcing citizens to buy cans on the open market. For example

a 26 gallon rust-proof can with cover if purchased by carload lot can be sold and delivered to each resident for \$3 or less. The present retail price is \$5 or over. Requests for quotations have been made to all leading distributors. Other plans are to encourage businesses and institutions throwing away large amounts of refuse to purchase special portable rectangular cans which can be hoisted on a specially built truck.
