New shelves and venetian blinds have also added to the attractiveness of the room. The chairs, tables, shelves and blinds were bought out of a \$950 special grant for remodeling from the Women's Division of Christian Service of the Methodist Church.

A library has been organized. At present the 14 members are learning how to operate a library. There are approximately 8,000 books in the library, subscriptions to 40 magazines and 7 newspapers, both daily and weekly.
