Joe B. Gaskin In Photo Business Half of Century

Sunday, March 19 was a memorable occasion in the life of Joe B. Gaskin, pioneer photographer of Camden, for it not only marked the 75th anniversary of his appearance on this mundane sphere, but the year 1950 tops the half century mark in the photographic business.
Born in the upper section of Kershaw county March 19, 1875 Joe has had a most varied career and has been in every state in the Union, also in Canada and in Mexico. While his life has been largely devoted to the photographic business there were fifteen years that he appeared on the vaudeville stage as a juggler and magician. And if anyone doubts that the old master has lost his cunning, let him show you some of his magic. In direct contrast to most people who have passed three score years, when old age creeps on at an amazing pace, Joe actually seems to be getting younger. A few days ago we watched him tear up the

front steps of the postoffice, three steps at a time and without blowing a cylinder. A friend who was with this writer at the time remarked: "That fellow is as agile as a man of 30 years."
Mr. Gaskin has four children, two boys and two girls. One child resulted from his union with his first wife who was Miss Mary Ballard and who died July 4, 1904. His second wife was Miss Eula Marshall and three children graced this union. All of the children are alive, Joseph B. Gaskin, Jr., and Mrs. Lois Grant, being residents of this city at the present time. Mrs. Grant will be remembered as Lois Gaskin who exuded her charming personality when with the Western Union here. Joseph, Jr., is one of the promising and outstanding young business men of the city.
Anyhow Sunday, March 19, was

quite a day in the Gaskin family and if Joe looked a bit tired late in the afternoon, it was just due to that big birthday dinner that he presided at in his home on Halle street.
