

Blease Leads; McLeod Second

Kearse, Smoak, Tant Win; Hunter, McCormack Run Over

With less than 150 votes out at midnight Tuesday, J. C. Kearse has been nominated representative over W. L. Riley, the vote being 1,040 for Kearse and 544 for Riley.

W. B. Smoak defeats both his opponents for supervisor on the first ballot. The vote was: Hightower 184; Kearse 277; Smoak 1,119.

Tant defeats Collins for upper district county commissioner, the vote being: Collins 500; Tant 1,068.

G. W. Hunter and J. B. McCormack run over for lower district commissioner. The vote: Hunter 504; McCormack 605; Zeigler 451.

There was no opposition to Congressman Byrnes, Auditor Rowell, Treasurer Jennings, or any of the cotton weighers.

Cole L. Blease has a lead of 10,000 votes over McLeod in the race for governor, and there will be a second race between Blease and McLeod. At 5 o'clock Wednesday morning the opponents of Blease had a combined majority of 15,521 over Blease.

E. B. Jackson is probably nominated for lieutenant governor on the first ballot, being far in the lead of either of his opponents.

Dove is nominated secretary of state to succeed himself over Dozier, outdistancing the latter by many thousands of votes.

Attorney General Wolfe appears to be renominated over both of his opponents.

Comptroller General Duncan is renominated by a large majority.

The race for superintendent of education is a very close one, and it appears certain that Swearingen will run over with Hope.

Craig has a long lead over his opponent, Marshall, for adjutant and inspector general.

B. Harris goes in again as commissioner of agriculture over Wightman, the vote being nearly two to one.

Logan is renominated congressman from the first district over both opponents.

Fulmer is renominated to succeed himself over A. J. Bethea and J. J. Mahan.

Dominick appears to have a safe lead over all of his opponents in the third congressional district.

Dickinson, Gunnells and Ray Elected Magistrates

E. Dickinson has been nominated for magistrate at Bamberg over T. J. Rentz.

S. S. Ray is victorious over J. B. Gillam as magistrate at Denmark.

Jeff Gunnells wins out over A. F. Morris for magistrate at Olar.

The Fish Pond magistrate race appears in doubt, and cannot be decided until the Edisto box is reported. There will be a second race in this contest.

It appeared likely that the magistrate's contest at Ehrhardt may require a second race between Magistrate Yarley and one of his opponents, though this is not certain, as the Kearse box had not been heard from. This is a big box and may change the complexion of the contest.

McLeod Carries Bamberg County By Big Plurality

With three boxes, Farrell's, Kearse and Little Swamp out Tuesday night, it appeared likely that McLeod would receive as many votes in Bamberg county as all the other candidates combined.

Bamberg county gave Mrs. Drake a plurality of votes over the other candidates for state superintendent of education.

The county gave Jackson a majority vote for lieutenant

governor, and Dove a big majority for secretary of state.

Attorney General Wolfe was the favorite for that office, lacking only a few of receiving a majority.

Comptroller General Duncan secured a big vote over his opponent, Gooding.

Craig and Marshall almost evenly divided honors for adjutant and inspector general.

B. Harris has a big lead in the county for commissioner of agriculture.
