Medway, Mass., Oct. 13.—Elmer L. Videtto, a veteran of the Civil War, crippled and partly blind, has laid out a playground near his home here so that he may listen to the voices of children.

For years Videtto visited the schools and told the pupils war stories. When after the most recent of several accidents he was obliged to give up active work as a stone mason, he conceived the idea of bringing the children to him. He purchased the land across the street from his home and although the infirmities of 75 years and his injuries made the work slow, he cleared away the underbrush, and built seats, swings and tilting boards for his child friends.

Here the children gather each day while Videtto sits on the veranda of his home or mingles with them to tell again the stories they love to hear.
