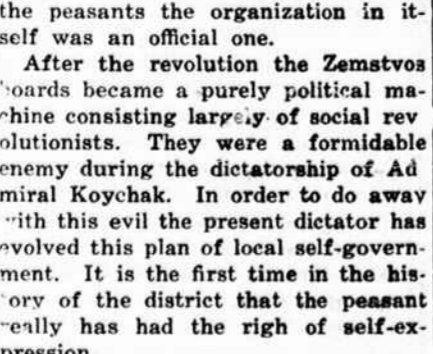

Scientists Labor to Control Locusts

Philadelphia, Oct. 23.—The quiet, unobtrusive labor of two Philadelphia scientists during recent years in the realm of locusts, grasshoppers, and katydids may save the United States millions of dollars, in the future. It is demonstrated each year in the Near East, South America, and other regions, how possible it is for a locust horde, large enough to darken the sky for hours, to rise out of nowhere and eat to the ground thousands of miles of harvest.

The two men, James A. G. Rehm, recording secretary of the Academy of Sciences, this city, and Morgan Hebard, research associate, returned recently from a tour of Southwest United States in the course of which they gathered no less than 9,000 locust specimens. Mr. Rehm declared that they are now approaching the end of the survey they set themselves to make of this portion of the insect world fifteen years ago.

"One can never know," declared Mr. Rehm, "when some species will arise in overwhelming numbers, as the Rocky Mountain locust did in the late seventies and early eighties. This species swept from its native habitat in Montana and the Northwest generally, clear down through the wheat states as far south as Texas, devouring every growing thing in its path."

The annual cost to the world at large of locust plagues is about \$100,000,000. Last year 5,000 acres in British Columbia were stripped and in the Orient, South Africa, the Levant, and South America these insects descend on crops with deadly regularity.

In the building of the Academy of Science here there are approximately four hundred thousand specimens of locusts, representing 40,000 separate and distinct species, the largest collection in the world. Supporting the specimens is an unparalleled store of well correlated data, readily available for reference.

Hydro-Electric Power Shows Growth

Tokio, Oct. 23.—Power produced by hydro-electric plants in Japan continue to show steady growth. The generating power recorded an increase of 40,000 kilowatts during the first half of last year over the corresponding period of the preceding year, and an increase of 81,000 kilowatts during the first half of the current year over the corresponding period of the preceding year.

Marriages in Germany Show Decrease

Berlin, Oct. 21.—The number of births in Germany for the first quarter of 1922 show a large decrease over the same period for 1921. According to statistics just issued, the number of marriages during these three months was 8.4 per thousand persons as against 10.4 for last year.

Irish Premier's Assistants Are Young Men

Dublin, Oct. 23.—The provision under the Free State constitution that ministers directing important departments shall not be members of parliament has afforded opportunity of appointing to such posts men of ability irrespective of their political popularity.

Notable among the members of the provisional government today are Kevin O'Higgins, Minister for Home Affairs, who was rather a storm center in the late Dail. Today he is conciliatory, in tempered and very lucid and persuasive in explanation.

Mr. O'Higgins was trained for the law. He was a solicitor's apprentice, serving his time in the office of Maurice Healy, former member of parliament in the Sinn Fein movement and consequent arrest by the police prevented his actual entrance into the legal profession.

Next in importance is Ernest Blythe, now minister for local government and in charge of all the public administrative bodies in Ireland, both municipal and rural. He also was in jail, and during the Sinn Fein regime was minister of trade. He is very young; comes from the six county area, and speaks English with a strong Ulster accent.

Patrick O'Hogan, a young solicitor whose father was a chief official of the Irish Land Commission and whose uncle, Monsignor Hogan, was president of St. Patrick's College, Maynooth, administers the Agricultural Department.

These three young men are Mr. Cosgrave's chief assistants. They all share fully the common sense attitude which has marked his conduct since he became prime minister. That attitude is firm and less yielding than from either Mr. Griffith or Mr. Collins. His purpose is fixed and declared. He is being led into speculative debate, and resists all suggestions to "make it unanimous," unless unanimity means frank acceptance of the position he is maintaining.

The humorous speeches Mr. Cosgrave said to make in the last Dail are now rare with him, but when he is getting his own way he still occasionally indulges the house with a laugh. On the question of the necessity of putting down an armed opposition to the Civil government he is uncompromising, and the exploits of the irregulars in raids and ambushes strengthen his determination.
