COLLETON WILL CONTINUE WORK

Delegation Agrees to Make Appropriation for Support of Home Demonstration Work.

Miss Dora Dee Walker, assistant State agent for the home demonstration work in South Carolina, was at SMOAKS community fair Friday for the purpose of conferring with the delegation as to their desires in regard to continuing the home demonstration work for next year. Senator Padgett and Representatives Goodwin and SMOAK were present, and at once agreed to insert the item in the county supply bill when the legislature meets in January. They provided that the two agents should receive the same salary and the same expense account, provided Miss Tweedie Fickling and Miss Emma Jane Varn were to be the agents for the county next year. This Misses Fickling and Varn agreed to do, and the agreement was accordingly signed. Under its provisions both these ladies will work for the entire year. This year, Miss Varn will not work during December, and she receives less for her work than Miss Fickling. The delegation and "Mother" Walker were delighted at the showing made for their year's work, and were very complimentary to both the young ladies who have performed such splendid work during the year. It is thought that with the experiences gained this year they will be able to do even better work next year. The plan will be to continue the same division of territory next year, each of the agents being in charge of about one-half of the county. Miss Varn will have her headquarters at SMOAKS and Miss Fickling at Walterboro.
