FBI Powerless In N. C. Kidnap Case

WASHINGTON (ANP) - No violation of federal law was involved in the kidnaping of Godwin (Buddy) Bush from the Northampton County jail in Jackson, N. C., according to J. Edgar Hoover, director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. Hoover, who was being held in custody as a suspect in the alleged kidnaping of a white woman, was taken from the jail by a truck of a certain who forced their way into the prison and carried him to a waiting automobile. Bush took the chance of breaking away from the mob, and fleeing into the darkness. The shot fired at him by one of the members of the mob missed, and the fleeing prisoner hid in a woodshed for 48 hours before placing himself in the protective care of FBI agents, through contact with a minister.

THE FBI obtained confession from one of the members of the mob which implicated seven white persons. EVIDENCE GIVEN STATE. Hoover said the evidence in the case was examined by the department of justice which held that no reader may see the world through the eyes of a poet who happens to be a Negro instead of an open propagandist.
