SIX MONTHS TRAINING

SAYS ANTI-NEGRO TERROR ENVELOPING SOUTHLAND

CHICAGO (AP)—Southern whites are carrying on a reign of terror against Negroes, according to a statement contained in the habeas corpus petition of a former Negro policeman of Tampa, Fla., here last week in fighting extradition to the Brownsville, Fla., prison camp where he escaped 14 months ago while serving a life sentence for murder.

Pearl McAden, the 58-year-old patrolman and former deputy sheriff, believes he will be the victim of mob rule and lynch law if he is returned to the Florida prison camp. He contends that

"the man I killed, Charles Van Demhorst, alias Charles Moon, of Haynes City, Fla., was the aggressor and I killed in self-defense."

'46 ESCAPE

Convicted on April 22, 1944, McAden escaped from the prison on March 12, 1946, after being beaten, bruised and maimed by officers and constantly threatened with death by white prison guards because he was of the Negro race...

In certain sections of the South, a reign of terror has enveloped Negro citizens in their pursuit of happiness, McAden said. "Terror and lawlessness are spreading to other states of the South."

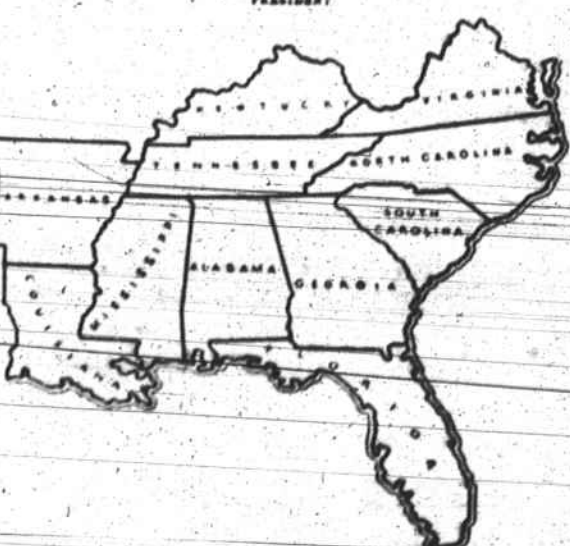
