

FEPC Hearings Shows GOP, South's Demos Similar On Negroes

WASHINGTON (ANP)—Hearings on the Ives-Chavez federal FEPC bill last week disclosed that a Missouri Republican shares the Negro-hating sentiments of a Louisiana Democrat.

A Philip Randolph, president of the Brotherhood of Sleeping Car Porters, discovered he had no friend in Sen. Forest C. Donnell, the Missouri chairman of the Senate labor and public welfare subcommittee, when Sen. Allen Joseph

Ellender referred to him as "Randolph, Democrat," and that Ellender had the right to refer to the witness in any manner he chose. Randolph retorted that he expected to be given the respect rightfully due him and said it is below the dignity of a senator of the United States to disregard the rights of its citizens. Randolph called Ellender's conduct "undignified, absurd, ridiculous and preposterous."

CHARGES CREDIT

A bitter verbal clash ensued when the Louisiana Democrat rejected the social equality issue into the questioning of Randolph, who is co-chairman of the Committee for a Permanent FEPC. Ellender wanted to know about a public statement attributed to Randolph that said if Negroes were not allowed fair employment, they would take it. He charged Randolph took credit for forcing the President of the United States (Roosevelt) to write out executive order 8802, establishing the temporary FEPC.

Amid interruptions from the committee, Randolph was able to issue the warning that "discrimination was too great a luxury for the American economy to enjoy, and declared that "segregation was sucking the very life blood from the South."

"If you lived down there you would find it different," Ellender quickly replied.

CONSCIOUS OF DIGNITY

The Louisiana Democrat asked Randolph why Negroes were not satisfied with separate facilities. If they were equal, why would a Negro protest being separate facilities just because one was marked white and another colored? he asked. All human beings are conscious of a certain moral and spiritual dignity, Randolph replied. Ellender theorized that political equality would mean social equality and social equality would be detrimental. He then charged against social equality for Negroes as long as he lives, Ellender said.

Senate Subcommittee For U. S. Aid To Education

Measure Sets Minimum \$5 Per Child Grant

WASHINGTON (ANP)—The Senate public welfare subcommittee Monday to approve a bill providing a federal grant of \$500,000 a year to the states for educational purposes. The measure provides for a federal allotment to each state of \$5 a child below the age of 17.

STATE DISCRETION

The states also have the discretion to whether aid should be given to non-public schools such as "aid institutions." The bill emphasizes the fact that federal government will have no control over the expenditure of funds by states; and that departments, agencies, offices and employees of the U. S. are forbidden from participating in the operation or prescribe any requirements with the methods of instruction or to require any change in state constitution as a prerequisite or benefitting under this bill.

CAB SEEKS TRIAL IN K' CITY DAMAGE SUIT

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (ANP)—A motion for a new trial in his \$200,000 suit against the Pla-Mor ballroom, charging assault and battery, and false arrest and imprisonment, was entered in circuit court here recently by Cab Callo, a popular orchestra leader.

The new trial is based on the contention that the court erred in not reprimanding defense counsel and failing to instruct the jury to disregard "unfair argument" and based on any evidence in the case. The motion was filed by Atty. M. J. Sullivan.

The damage suit is an outgrowth of Callo's dispute on growth of a ballroom's neglect on Dec. 22, 1945. According to the orchestra leader, he and Frank Payne, Jr., of Washington, attempted to enter the ballroom to visit Lionel Hampton whose group was playing there. A special guard objecting to their request to enter administered a beating to the orchestra leader and had the two men thrown in jail.

No date has been set for court action on the new trial motion.
