**JOHN W. WISE.**

Moore his pastor performing the last sad rites, and the large attendance at his funeral was evidence of the respect and high esteem in which he was held by his neighbors and acquaintances. He leaves to mourn his death six sons, George, Assman, Isom, Lee, Tally and Simpson Wise, his wife having preceded him to the grave several years ago.
