FOUR NEGROES KILLED BY LIGHTNING AT CAMP

During a heavy thunderstorm Saturday afternoon a bolt of lightning struck a shed at Camp Jackson, Columbia under which thirteen negro laborers were seeking shelter from the rain, killing four outright and wounding nine others some of whom may die.

The killed were William McCottire, of Georgetown; George Kitt, Branchville; Matthew Green, Eastover, and an unidentified negro.

The peculiar feature of the tragedy was that there was no sign of where the men had been hit or where the shed was damaged.

Another most peculiar feature, too, is the statement of one of the survivors who claims that he counted the number of men under the shed and, finding the "unlucky thirteen," there, started to leave as the bolt came, killing four and injuring the others, among whom was himself.
