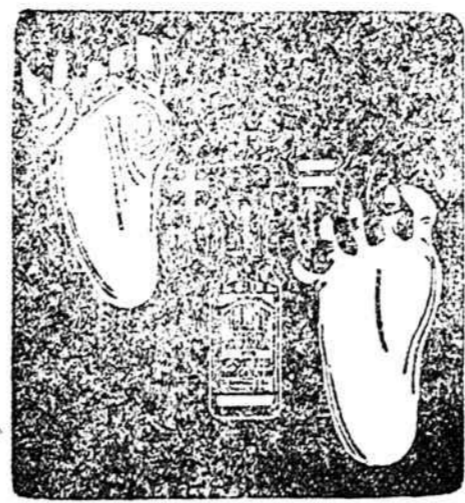

JIM CROW CARS IN CITY OF WASHINGTON

Washington, Sept. 23.—"Jim Crow" cars for Washington will soon be running if Representative Harrison, of Mississippi, succeeds in putting through a bill he introduced in the House a day or two ago.

He asked that all companies operating car lines in the District of Columbia be required to divide cars by means of partitions for black and whites, or to provide trailers for the colored passengers.

COTTON TOO LOW SAYS SENATOR RANDSDALL.
