COACH LUNCH SERVICE ON SOUTHERN RAILWAY.

Washington, Oct. 30.—"Coach lunch service" has been inaugurated on Southern Railway System trains carrying dining cars for the benefit of passengers who do not care for a complete meal while on their journey. Dining cars have been provided with basket trays and the waiters pass through the coaches announcing "sandwiches and coffee!" The sandwiches are wrapped in sanitary packages. Moderate prices for this service will be charged.

In order to cooperate with the United States Food administration the Southern's dining car service is observing Tuesday of every week as "beefless" day. On every day of the week the plea of Food Administrator Hoover to the American people to "eat plenty" but wisely and without waste during the war is brought to the attention of every passenger using the Southern's cars by an attractively printed folder outlining the general plan of the government's desire to reduce food waste to a minimum.

FOUR MURDER CASES IN CAMDEN COURT.

The court of general sessions opens at Camden this morning with Judge George E. Prince presiding. Several cases of widespread interest are on the docket for trial including the cases of two white women who are under separate indictments for murder. Lucy Marsh is charged with the killing of Estelle Baker. The woman was beaten to death with some instrument. T. R. Broxton, an overseer on the Goin plantation, will be placed on trial for killing a negro farm hand, Mrs. James Parker and her husband are in the county jail awaiting trial on charge of having murdered Racheal Carter. A shotgun is alleged to have been the instrument of death.
