from 21 to 60 years of age, except

21 to 55 years. All dogs are subject

to a capitation tax of 50c, and must

be returned at the same time when

returning other property.

UNITED STATES FOOD ADMINISTRATION SOUTH CAROLINA.

Columbia, Dec. 17.—The Legal Di-
vision of the United States Food Ad-
ministration has issued the following
ruling:

"Planters who buy yearly between
August 31st, and September 1st,
150 tons or more of cotton seed,
whether from their tenants or others
are subject to license and must con-
form to the laws and regulations of
the Food Administration."
