At Twelve Cent Pre-War Prices. One 500 lb. bale of cotton at \$60 would have bought-80 bus. Corn at \$0.75 ·12 bbls. Flour at \$5.00 3000 lbs. Corn Meal at \$0.02 600 lbs. Lard at \$0.10 500 lbs. Salt Pork at \$0.12 400 lbs. Bacon at \$0.15

At Thirty Cent Pre-War Prices. One 500 lb. bale of Cotton at \$150 will buy-

75 bus. Corn at \$2.00 12 bbls. Flour at \$12.50 2,143 lbs. Corn Meal \$0.07 484 lbs. Lard at \$0.31 455 lbs. Salt Pork \$0.33 366 lbs. Bacon at \$0.41

These conditions are not likely to improve, emphasizing all the more the absolute importance at this time of planting plenty of corn and other food crops.
