## NITRATE SODA FOR

### SOUTHERN FARMS

Washington April 19.—It is an-  
nounced at the department of agri-  
culture that a large consignment of  
nitrate of soda has been received at  
the docks at Norfolk, Va., which will  
be shipped to southern farms at once  
at cost.

The nitrate is bought in Latin-  
American countries under the act of  
congress appropriating \$20,000,000  
for this purpose. The director-gen-  
eral has ordered that it be given a  
right of way so that there will be no  
delay in delivery owing to railway  
congestion.

## OBITUARY

Rev. Lemuel Hall fell asleep in Je-  
sus in the home of his daughter, Mrs.  
B. L. Kirkland, of Lexington county  
April the 10th 1918.

He was born Christmas day, 1930,  
making his long and most worthy ca-  
reer in this life 87 years, 3 months  
and 15 days. On the 5th day of  
June 1853 he was united in the holy  
bonds of matrimony to Miss Eliza  
Ann Mims. To this union was ad-  
ded three sons and six daughters one  
son and one daughter and his wife  
preceded him long ago to the home of  
the blessed.

Shortly after his marriage he and  
his companion united with the Bap-  
tist church and lived according to  
their profession as long as life existed  
among the things that were precious  
in his sight was that he lived to see  
all his children embrace the divine  
religion which he possessed.

In the war of the Sixties he served  
his trade manufacturing fire arms  
in the Government shop in Atlanta,  
Ga., and was the first of his comrades  
to make a bayonet that would bear  
inspection.

Back in the days of the prime of  
life, the buggy, the wagon; the cart  
and the developing power of differ-  
ent manufacturing plants all carried  
his mark as a professional wheel-  
right.

A great host of friends and seven  
children, fifty-four, grand children  
and thirty-eight great grand children  
deeply mourn the sad departure of  
him, on the 28th day of Oct. 1871  
nearly 47 years ago he was ordained  
to the ministry, the late J. M. Jef-  
coat and I. D. Durham, officiating,  
and every moment of his time not  
employed in laboring for sustenance  
of life was devoted to studying the  
word of God and carrying the mes-  
sage to others. Walking the most  
of his time from church to church  
many of which he supplied night and  
day, cold and hot, sunshine and rain  
he never faltered. But loyal to his  
King and calling.

He was endowed with a deep com-  
prehension of the scriptures such as  
only a few possess and could be re-  
lied upon at any and all times for ad-  
vice. He was very indulgent and ex-  
tremely fond of children especially  
those in the home where he lived and  
no one in this world can restore his  
presence or fill the vacant place he  
left to the ones he was so much at-  
tached. But may they strive each  
day to immitate the life he lived. He  
was instrumental in organizing sev-  
eral churches and a great councillor  
in effecting a reconciliation. His  
membership being with providence  
church at the time of his death. A  
very able and encouraging sermon  
by Rev. N. N. Burton of Batesburg,  
was preached on the resurrection of  
the dead. A subject which always  
thrilled the heart and soul of the de-  
ceased with joy.

## DISLOYAL ACTS SHOULD BE REPORTED

Charleston, S. C. April 19, 1918.—  
(Special)—It has come to the notice  
of this office that many people fail to  
report suspicious and disloyal acts or  
manifestations of sympathy for the  
enemy, because of uncertainty as to  
the proper official to approach.

It is very important that the Gov-  
ernment should have the assistance  
of all citizens in detecting enemy pro-  
paganda or suspicious activities of in-  
dividuals, and you will do a service in  
notifying your friends that any com-  
munication addressed to "Intelligence  
Officer, Headquarters Southeastern  
Department, Charleston, S. C." will  
receive attention and be transmitted  
to the proper official of the Govern-  
ment for investigation. The names  
of informants will not be divulged  
and there need be no fear, on the  
part of anybody, of getting into trou-  
ble in case suspicions prove to be un-  
founded.

Information should indicate the na-  
ture and source of their information  
as well as the time and place.

## FLOUR SALES REDUCED.

All merchants are requested  
strictly observe the latest rule re-  
garding the sale of flour whereby only  
50 pounds of flour may be sold to a  
person living in rural districts and  
only 25 pounds to a person living  
within a corporated town.

It should also be remembered by  
both merchants and millers that flour  
can only be sold when an equal amount  
of flour substitute is sold or  
when a miller's certificate is pre-  
sented showing that the party de-  
siring to purchase flour has had  
ground within ten days prior to the  
date he desires to purchase flour an  
equal amount of corn meal or grits.

Miller's certificates should only be  
issued upon the printed form pre-  
pared and sent out by the government.

Merchants should honor no millers  
certificate unless the same is present-  
ed within ten days after it is given.

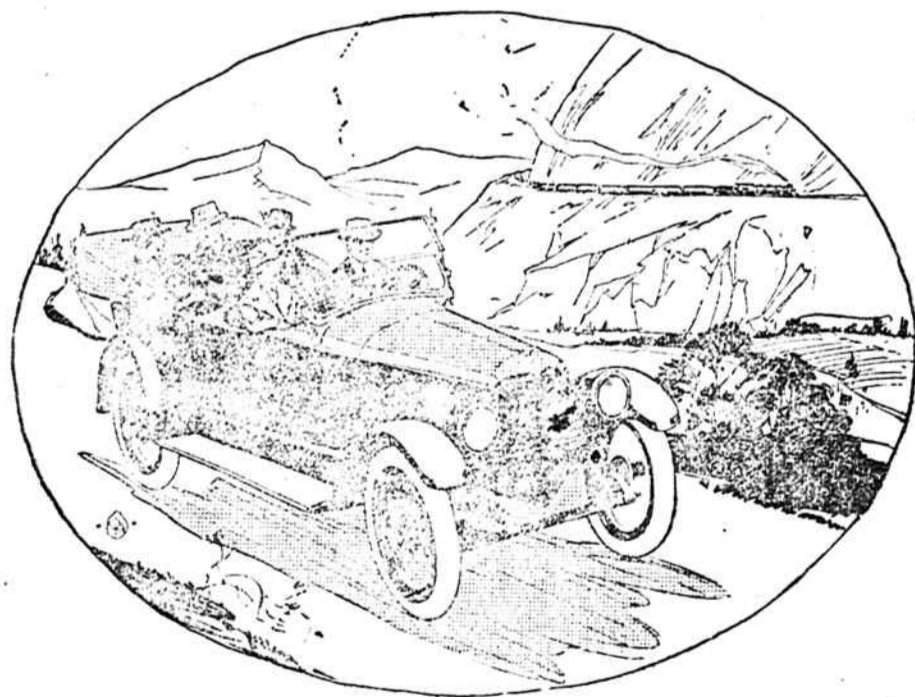
