TO BUILD 800 HOMES FOR WORKMEN NEAR NORFOLK

Norfolk, Va., June 8.—The hous-
ing committee of the Hampton Roads
Naval district announced today that
tracts of land on Paradise Creek in
Norfolk county, aggregating about
five hundred acres had been acquired
and that the government will finance
the erection of a model town of 800
residences, for workmen employed
at the naval base, army and ordnance
depots.

Designs for the village by George
B. Post, of New York, have been ap-
proved and work will begin at once.
The property is located about three
miles from the Portsmouth postoffice
and is reached by trolley. Rear Ad-
miral Harris, head of the housing
board, will direct the construction
work.

GEN. PERSHING HAD PERSONAL CHARGE OF THE CATIGNY BATTLE

Washington, June 8.—Gen. Persh-
ing personally directed the fighting
of American troops at Cantigny, from
where the Germans were driven with
a loss of 200 prisoners, members of
the senate military committee were
told at their weekly conference with
war department officials.

The village was taken by the Amer-
icans May 28 and all German attempts
to recapture it have been in vain.

The important part American
troops have taken in checking the re-
cent German drive was told to the sen-
ators, who were informed that the ad-
vance probably has been stopped for
the time being.

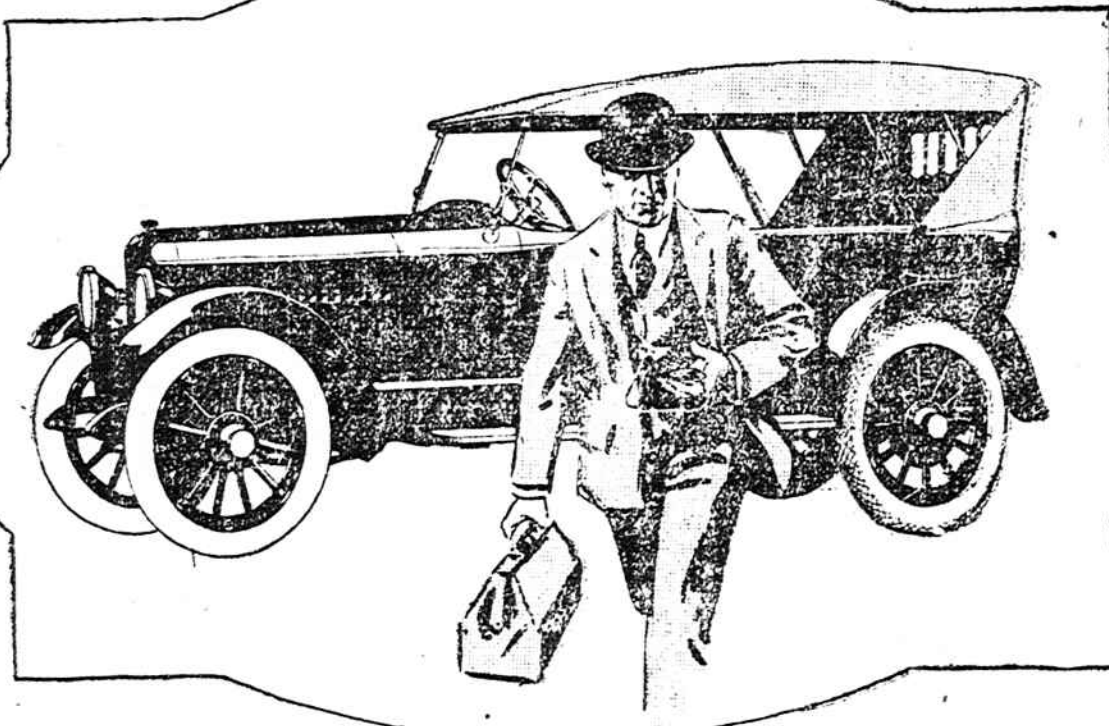
