

**PROF. S. J. DERRICK
NEWBERRY'S PRESIDENT**

The board of trustees of Newberry college met Monday afternoon and among other business transacted elected a president to succeed Dr. J. H. Harms, who will leave about the 15th instant for Philadelphia to assume the duties as pastor of the Church of the Holy Communion of that city, one of the largest and most influential Lutheran churches in America.

The board unanimously selected Prof. S. J. Derrick for president of the college, but for certain reasons did not announce their decision until Tuesday morning.

Prof. Sidney J. Derrick has been connected with the college for 22 years, and is peculiarly fitted to fill the position as president of the institution. He for several years was at the head of the preparatory department, later taking up the department of history and economics.

Prof. Derrick is a native of Lexington county, having been born near Little Mountain and is about 50 years of age. He is a son of J. J. Derrick and Martha Kesler Derrick. He graduated from Newberry college in 1892, and was prepared for college by Prof. E. O. Counts in Mt. Tabor school Newberry county.

There is general satisfaction expressed in Newberry on the selection of the board and Prof. Derrick is receiving the congratulations of his hosts of friends.

He is a member of the state board of education, a member of the local war board and is an uncle of Congressman A. F. Lever.

WINTHROP COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP and ENTRANCE EXAMINATION

The examination for the award of vacant scholarships in Winthrop College and for the admission of new students will be held at the County Court House on Friday, July 5, at 9 A. M. and also on Saturday, July 6, at 9 A. M. for those who wish to make up by examinations additional units required for full admission to the Freshman Class of this institution. The examination on Saturday, July 6, will be used only for making admission units. The scholarships will be awarded upon the examination held on Friday, July 5. Applicants must not be less than sixteen years of age. When scholarships are vacant after July 5 they will be awarded to those making the highest average at this examination, provided they meet the conditions governing the award. Applicants for scholarships should write to President Johnson for scholarship examination blanks. These blanks properly filled out by the applicant, should be filed with President Johnson by July 1st.

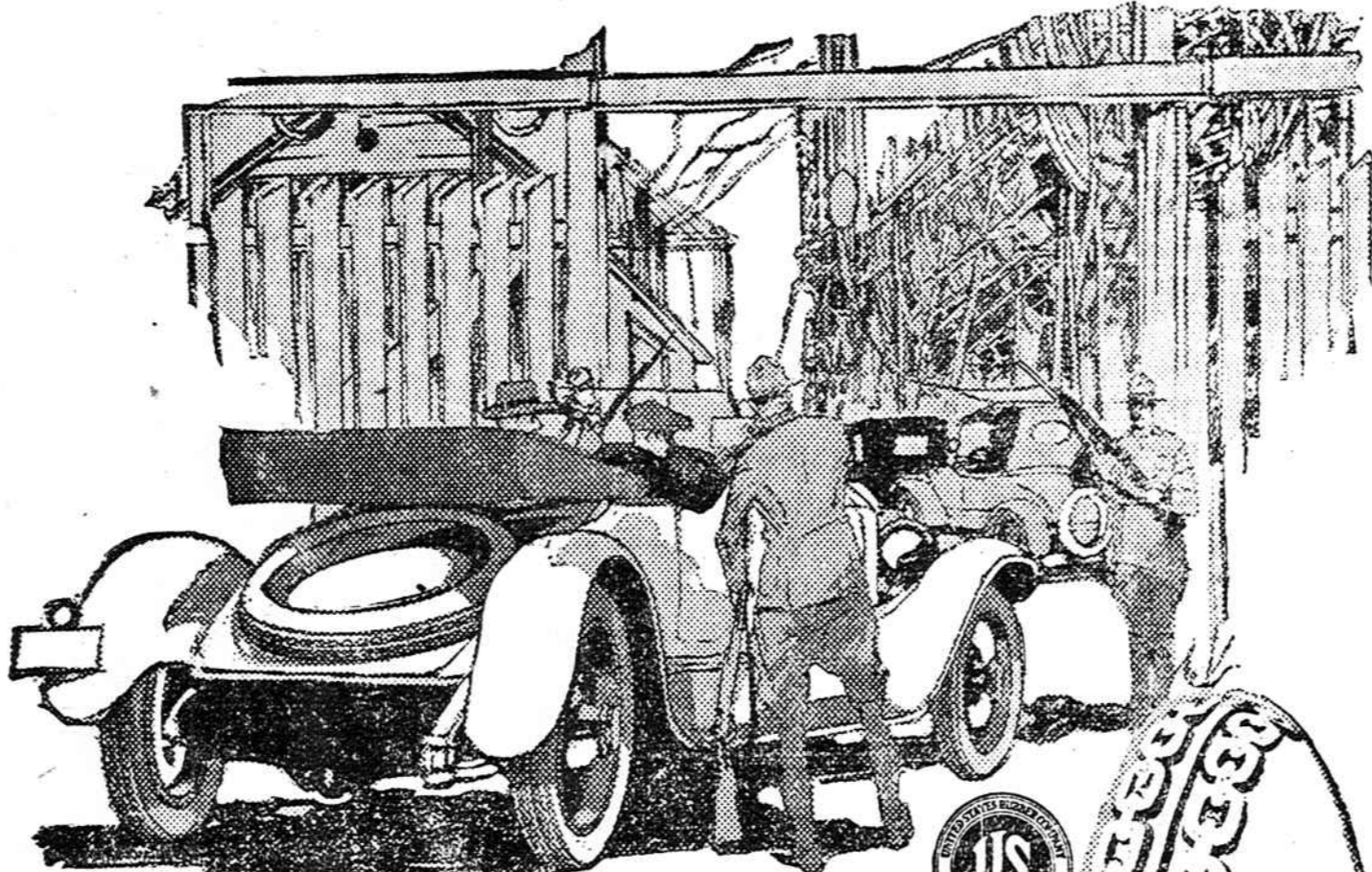

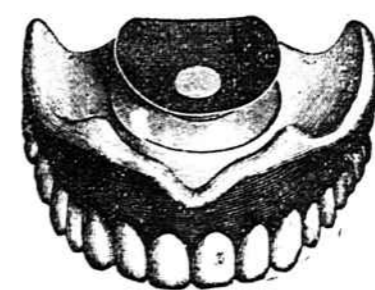
