RAILHOADS RETURN TO OWNERS NEXT YEAR.

Hon Frank W. Shealy, State railroad Commissioner, returned last week from Indianapolis, where he attended a meeting of the National Association of Railway and Rublic Utility Commissions. Mr. Shealy reports a pleasant trip and an interesting meeting. He was highly honored by being selected among the very first on some of the most important commit-

The association was addressed by Director General Walker D. Hines, Chairman Etchinson of the Interstate Commerce Commission, Max Theland, director general of public service; and made by C. E. Elmquest, president of the association.

The most interesting announcement made at the convention was the declaration by Director General Hines that the railroads of the country would be turned back to their original rs December 31 of this year, Mr. Hines said that the United States was too big a country to have the railroads operated from Washington and that the only practical plan was the one of dual control which had heretofore existed, with the Interstate Commerce Commission overlooking interstate commerce and the .state commissions having charge of the intrastate end.

Mr. Shealy, who has been working hard during the trying period of war control to protect the interests of South Carolina, and who has succeeded notably well, had hoped that his trip would give him a little rest, but he was kept busily at work during the convention attending the matters coming before the committees of which he was a member.

Destroying the cotton stalks is the most effective control against the weevil.
