The postmaster calls attention to the following from the postal laws and regulations:

Sec. 198. Each post-office box or drawer, in all post-offices, is restricted to the use of one family, firm or company, and the rent therefor must be paid at least one quarter in advance.

Sec. 201. A person renting a post-office box is entitled to have the letters of his family, firm or company put into it. Letters addressed to his friends stopping temporarily with him may also be placed in the box if directed to his care or to the number of the box.
