The American Government through Herbert Hoover has inaugurated a national campaign to urge the saving of food stuffs. Mr. Hoover has termed this movement for the registration of the people in food saving as "an unprecedented adventure in democracy." It is a national campaign projected so large in its scope that the

work to be done is as great as though a census of the country was being taken.

If the American people are informed they will respond. If they respond then bread and meat cards will not be necessary. But we have been asked during the week of October 21-28th to sign this card:

I AM GLAD TO JOIN YOU IN THE SERVICE OF FOOD CONSERVATION FOR OUR NATION AND I HEREBY ACCEPT MEMBERSHIP IN THE UNITED STATES FOOD ADMINISTRATION, PLEDGING MYSELF TO CARRY OUT THE DIRECTIONS AND ADVICE OF THE FOOD ADMINISTRATOR IN MY HOME, INsofar AS MY CIRCUMSTANCES PERMIT.

There are no fees or dues to be paid. The Food Administrator wishes to have as members all of those actually handling food in the home. All women over sixteen are eligible.

The Government does not ask you for your food; does not urge you to quit eating, but merely requests you to save your own food for your own consumption, but in doing so, to consume it with wisdom, judiciously, and thereby help "win the war."

If you are already economizing, sign the card as an earnest of your

willingness to "do your bit" and as a protest against your neighbor who is not economizing. If you can save something, then sign the card to help yourself carry out your determination and also to show the Government that her people are behind her.

FARM POINTERS.

When you think of the high cost of flour remember that you can raise in acre of wheat this winter for home use at very little expense. The wheat can be cut and thrashed by hand the same as rice, and ground in a corn mill. The flour will be brown, but the quality is much better than that of white flour. Plant the seed now, or early in the fall using 1 to 1 1-2 bushels per acre. Prepare the ground and plant the same as oats. Wheat planted now will be off by the middle of May, giving time for a crop of sweet potatoes, or a hay crop after the wheat. If you can't plant an acre then plant a half or a quarter, but be sure to plant some wheat.

Do your hogs look bad and won't fatten according to their feed? If so, use this tonic. It is especially good for worms. For worms: Charcoal, 1 bushel; salt, 1 bushel; molasses, 1 bushel; soft, 5 per cent. dissolved lime, 8 pounds; sulphur, 4 pounds; pulverized corn cobs, 2 pounds. Mix lime, salt, and sulphur thoroughly and then mix with the charcoal and ashes. Dissolve the corn cobs in 2 pails of hot water and sprinkle over the whole mass. Store away in a barrel under shelter. Keep some of the mixture in a box before the hogs all the time so they can eat it any time.

If your hogs are lousy and you can't dip them use this plan. Put down a good stout post in the hog lot and wrap it with two or three sacks. Wet the e sacks with creosote dip. When the hogs rub on this post they get the dip on them.

When you are in the Loris section again step to see the sweet potato storage house that Mr. B. H. Hinson is building. This house is built according to U. S. Dept. of Agriculture plans and will store 600 bushels of potatoes. It cost about \$150.00. Watch it to see how it keeps potatoes.

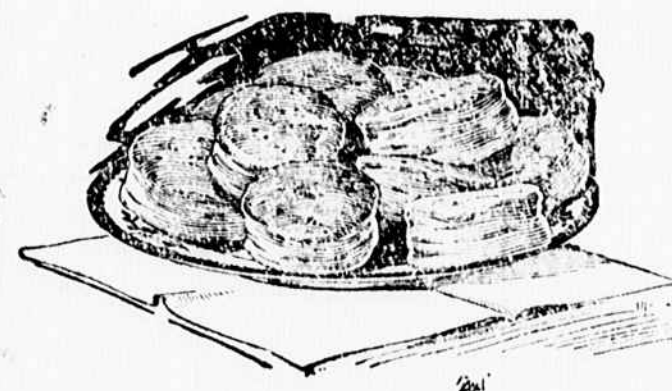

'Recipe for BAKING POWDER BISCUIT'
