As Mr. Jackson tried to turn it back into the road, he lost control of the steering apparatus and the machine turned turtle, burying the occupants underneath. Help soon arrived and the young men were carried to the home of James Willes and medical assistance was summoned. Dr. Kings of Iva attended to the young men's injuries and he says that he hopes neither sustained any serious injury, although he was not able to determine Friday night. The accident happened within half a mile of Barnes station.

## Local People Will Watch Work of Cotton Technologist in Calling on Spinners

During the time that Fred Taylor filled the office of carding instructor at Clemson college he made a number of friends in Anderson and Anderson county and many of these will be interested in learning that he has been honored by being selected for a very important mission. At present Taylor is cotton technologist for the office of markets department of agriculture and he will sail from New York on June 23 for the European cities where he will visit all the principal spinning cities of England, France and Germany with a view to ascertain the conditions under which the staple cotton is marketed. Mr. Taylor has been in charge of the cotton handling and marketing investigations conducted by the office of markets in this country, and his trip abroad will be an extension of that work. During the past five months Mr. Taylor has been conducting spinning tests in various cottons at the New Bedford Textile school. The study included Arizona Egyptian cotton, sea island cotton and Egyptian Sakellides cotton, the object being to determine the relative spinning values of these three varieties. The cotton tested was from 1-1/2 inch to 1-5/8 inch staple. Mr. Taylor has practically completed these tests, and he returned to Washington to prepare samples of the yarn. He has spun before he leaves for Europe. The department of agriculture has made extensive use of the facilities offered by the New Bedford Textile school in its investigations of the various cottons. A year or more ago Mr. Taylor made comparative studies of long staple cotton raised in the Mississippi and the selected varieties of long staple raised in the eastern part of the cotton belt by Coker, Webber and the other well known plant breeders. On his return from Europe he is to make further study of these same cottons to determine to what extent they vary from year to year.
