ANDERSON HAS MANY OLD CLEMSON MEN

THE HOME COMING

Every Part of South Carolina Will Send Some of 5,000 to the Clemson Gathering

There is hardly a spot in South Carolina represented by even a dot on the map, which will not send some one or two "old" cadets back to Clemson on August 27, when "Home Coming Week" opens at this famous institution. Great credit should be given Dr. Riggs for his clever idea in arranging this week for the old students of Clemson college.

A number of Anderson's prominent business men are graduates of Clemson, and these, together with all the old Clemson boys in Anderson yesterday received a letter from Dr. Riggs, telling of the plans for the week and urging an immediate acceptance of the invitation to be present. This invitation was not confined to the graduates of the institution but to every old Clemson man.

In his letter, Dr. Riggs said that he expected more people to be present for the week than the college would be able to accommodate. He urges, for that reason, that no one else come to the college between August 27-31, except old students and asks that the students refrain from inviting any of their friends. In his letter he also points out that it will be impossible for the college to make such preparation for the entertainment of ladies, and therefore the wives, mothers and sweethearts of the former cadets will have to stay at home.

It is hard to even form an estimate of the number expected to attend for the week, but it is believed that it will surpass any college gathering ever seen in South Carolina. A number of amusements have been arranged and while the pleasures will be entirely informal, every minute of the entire week will be taken up with some pastime and amusement.
