BAILEY MURDER BEING PROBED

DETECTIVES HAVE STRUCK A NEW CLUE THAT MAY GET RESULTS

MAID DENIES STORY

Did Not See Mrs. Carman Until After Murder Is Story Now Told

Mineola, N. Y., July 14.—While the grand jury today was hearing nine witnesses tell what they knew about the mysterious murder of Mrs. Louise Bailey and the actions of Mrs. Florence Conklin Carman just before and after the crime, detectives were running down a new clue. District Attorney Smith said he believed to lead to the finding of the two strange women whom Mrs. Carman and her sister, Mrs. Ida Powell, said they saw hurrying away directly after Mrs. Bailey fell to the floor of Dr. Edwin Carman's office in Freeport with a bullet through her heart.

These women, the district attorney asserted, may offer corroboration to the testimony of Elwood T. Barges at the inquest and the story told the grand jury today by Cella Coleman, a negro maid in the Carman home.

COTTON CROP ON THE MAKE

WEATHER CONDITION OVER THE ENTIRE BELT VERY FAVORABLE

RAIN STILL NEEDED

The Showers Have Been Beneficial But There Is Not Enough Moisture Yet

Washington, July 14.—General favorable weather in the cotton growing states during the past week was reported today in the National weather and crop bulletin. It said: "Generous showers over the eastern states greatly favored growth and the plant is generally reported as being in good condition. In the central portions of the belt local rains greatly benefited the crop in Arkansas and Louisiana, and in parts of Mississippi, but rain is badly needed in the last named state as well as in Tennessee."

"In Texas and Oklahoma but little rain occurred and the soil is now becoming very dry; the early planted cotton is reported as doing well, however, but the late planted is much in need of rain."

Washington, July 14.—Cotton consumed during June was 445,635 bales, exclusive of bales compared with 441,187 in June last year. The census bureau announced today that consumption for the ten months ending June 30 was 4,745,390 bales, against 4,558,729 a year ago, and in independent warehouses 630,723 compared with 609,360 a year ago.

Exports during June were 295,539 bales against 223,921 last year, and for the ten months 3,873,371 against 3,403,684 a year ago.

Exports were 47,070,294 bales against 3,019 last year, and for the ten months 227,413 against 210,364 a year ago.

W. S. CURRELL IS PRESIDENT
