NEW ADVANCES

Sugar Bears Still Higher in Prices. New York, Aug. 12. The upward tendency of the sugar market continues and new high records were again made today when fine granulated sugar was quoted at 6.50 to 7 cents and centrifugal 98 test at 5.55. The consumptive demand was very active both for local and foreign sugar and holders of raw sugar in Cuba had in many cases withdrawn offerings in exception of much higher prices.

CITY COUNCIL HAS CHOSEN NEW MEN FOR THE SERVICE

W. C. LEE, CHIEF OF POLICE TO BE SUCCEEDED BY J. W. SAMMONS. E. M. SCOTT WILL BE CITY CLERK. J. L. Foster, W. A. Clamp and W. S. Hall Will Be Added to the List of Patrolmen, Effective Sept. 1.

It was announced yesterday morning that a meeting of the Anderson city council would be held at 9 o'clock for the purpose of selecting certain new officials to serve the city during the ensuing term, but when that hour arrived and Alderman King had not returned to the city, it was necessary to again postpone the meeting. Mr. King arrived in the city yesterday afternoon about 6:30 o'clock and at 7 o'clock the new council with the exception of Alderman Tate, had assembled in the Chiquita hotel office. Mr. Tate had been called away from the city but left with the mayor a sealed ballot. Mayor Godfrey called the council to order at 7 o'clock in the hotel and the election was taken up. The following is a complete list of council's selection for the various offices: J. E. Barton, mayor pro tempore for a term of two years. E. N. Scott, city clerk and treasurer for a term of two years. G. Sullivan city attorney for a term of two years. G. B. Walton, auditor for a term of two years. J. A. Sammons, chief of police. Olin E. Bell captain of police. W. W. Driskell, J. W. Brown, M. M. Payne, J. W. Whitten, M. J. Aiken, M. M. Stuart, C. N. Sanders, W. C. Gunter (all former members of the police department); J. L. Foster (new), W. A. Clamp (new), and W. S. Hall (new), patrolmen. All members of the police department are elected to serve "during the pleasure of the mayor and city council." Thos. A. Campbell was recommended by the board of health for re-election as health officer for a term of one year. The recommendation was adopted. J. C. Gilmer was re-elected, as street overseer. The newly elected officers will assume their duties on September 1st. A committee consisting of Alderman Barton, Spearman and Carter, acting with the mayor was appointed to dispose of the West Market street drain matter so that the C. & W. C. railway can proceed with its terminal improvements. Election of officers and drivers and members of the fire department was postponed, also cemetery sexton and assistant sexton. These elections will occur at the September meeting of the council. Mayor Godfrey announced he would name the standing committees of the council in the next day or two. It will be seen from the list of those elected on the police force that Patrolmen James, McClelland and Holt were defeated for re-election while Chief Lee did not offer for the position again. J. L. Foster, one of the new members of the force is a carpenter, as is W. S. Hall, who will also become a patrolman, while W. A. Clamp, the third new member is now janitor at the court house and a special deputy. Considerable interest will now surround the election of a fire chief and the firemen for the next term.

ELECTRIC CITY SPARKLETS

Many Automobiles Being Bought Here. Already ranking well up with Richland and Greenville counties in the number of automobiles in use in the county, Anderson county bids fair to pass them all in point of machines if the present rate is kept up. Anderson automobile dealers simply can't get cars as fast as they can sell them and if the present rate is maintained a man on foot will soon have a chance at all, even out on a country road. John Sadler has just brought to Anderson for his garage a car load of Hupmobile machines and these will probably be sold within the next few days. Other dealers are equally taxed to supply the demand.

Short Darlington. Two mules, hitched to a wagon and tied in the rear of Todd's auto shop, became frightened yesterday when an automobile was cranked up and tried to run away. They ran to a good start and for a second or so it seemed that the wagon would be demolished but the sudden start of the frightened animals caused the wagon to be turned entirely over and as the hood flew off it came to the ground and struck on the hinges, holding them to the ground. This stopped the mules in short order and but little damage was done.

Capt. McCully Will Go to St. Petersburg. Dispatches from Washington reach Anderson yesterday which say that Capt. N. A. McCully, of the United States Navy, has been assigned to duty at St. Petersburg, Russia, and will leave for that point within the next few days. The dispatch says that Capt. McCully's friends in the navy are all anxious over this splendid appointment to service as it will enable the Anderson officer to see some real fighting. Capt. McCully has a number of friends in this city and county and they will all be pleased to learn that such confidence is reposed in him by the government officials.

Anderson Is New Exporting Center. Anderson already possesses a reputation of leading South Carolina in a number of things but it remained for James Thompson to establish Anderson's reputation as a great exporting center. He yesterday shipped to F. D. Simpson, at Toccoa, Ga., some of the finest Angora goats ever seen in this part of the country. They have long, silky wool, which is said to be worth about \$8.00 per pound and were perfect specimens in every respect. It is said that the goat-raising industry can be made very profitable in this section.

Members Went On The Excursion. Probably more people went from Anderson on the excursion to Washington yesterday afternoon than ever before. All told there were probably 50 or 60 to make the trip, but many of these went, not so much for the excursion, but to attend the Cotton Congress. Several of Anderson's best known merchants also went on this train, choosing to go now instead of a little later because of the material saying in railroad fares. The party left this city promptly at 2:25 yesterday afternoon and were announced to reach Washington this morning at 6:30 o'clock.
