London, Sept. 25.—An official statement received from Berlin by the Marconi wireless says: "The board of trustees of the Imperial Bank of Germany draw special attention to the fact that the bank has proved itself equal to exceptional demands made on it by the war and that Germany is armed both economically and financially to fight a war on all sides until results have been obtained which will secure the political and economical future of Germany."
